THE FLOORS.

Make the Floors of Your Home as Attractive as the Walls.

Too often the person who has decorated and furnished his own home is ready to die of exhaustion after the walls, hangings and furniture have received careful attention. Too often his money as well as his patience has given out, and any old rug or floor covering is thrown over the floors in the hope that no one will notice them.

But many will notice! Floors are the ballast of the house. They hold it down and preserve its dignity.

There is no floor so old that it cannot be planed down and painted three or four times into the envy of the neighborhood. Sage green, dark brown and even deep yellow floors can be used successfully with light green, tan and cream wall paper.

Bare Floors Not Desirable.

Once one has settled the kind of a floor desired, the next step is what covering to go over it. Only in the rarest instances is a bare floor desirable or practicable.

In a living room a one-tone carpet covering the entire floor gives a great sense of dignity. One or two delicate Orientals on top of the carpet makes for real luxury.

Several one-tone rugs that can be taken out and shaken are the most practical for bedrooms. Rag rugs, especially dyed and hand-made, are also charming, especially the oval ones.

Any hand-made rug is judged by the quality of wool used, the number of knots per inch and the intricacy and delicacy of design.

For most pocketbooks, plain tone machine-made rugs that blend in with the wallpaper and ceiling are advisable. Borders of a deeper tone give the rug more character and the room more variety.

COLD DRINKS.

Eggnogg

A delicious drink that contains the true life-giving food elements. Place one egg in a glass and then fill with milk, adding two tablespoons of sugar, one teaspoon of vanilla extract. Turn in a bowl and beat for five minutes. Pour in glass and dust with nutmeg. Cracked ice may be added if desired.

For a chocolate flavor add three tablespoons of chocolate syrup.

Chocolate Syrup.

One-half cup of sugar, one-half cup of water, one-half cup of cocoa. Place in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Stir constantly and cook for ten minutes. Add one tablespoon of vanilla extract, one-half teaspoon of cinnamon. Stir well and then pour into a bottle and keep in a cool place.

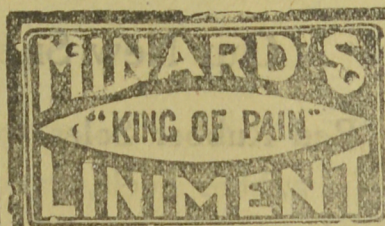
Egg, Milk and Orange Shake.

Juice of one orange, one egg, one-half cup of milk, two tablespoons of sugar, one-quarter teaspoon of nutmeg. Place in a bowl and beat with an egg beater for five minutes. Pour into tall thin glasses and serve ice cold.

BRIEF BUT USEFUL RECIPES.

Restore Glut Frames.—Rub with a sponge moistened with turpentine.

Drive Away Ants.—A little quick lime placed in the infested places.

Remove Tar from Cloth.—Rub it well with turpentine till every trace is removed.

Make Leather Waterproof.—Saturate it with castor oil; to stop shoes squeaking, drive a peg into the middle of the sole.

Clean the Hair.—Wash well with a mixture of soft water, 1 pint; sal soda 1 ounce; cream tartar ¼ ounce.

Egg Stains on Spoons.—Rub with common salt.

Clean Gloves.—Pour a little benzine into a basin and wash the gloves in it, rubbing and squeezing them until clean. If much soiled, they must be washed again through clean benzine and rinsed in a fresh supply.

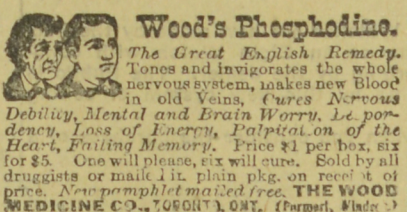
Clean Hair Brushes.—Dissolve a little soda in warm water and pour in a small amount of ammonia. Hold the brushes with the bristles downward and avoid wetting the back as far as possible; shake until the grease is removed; then rinse in cold water and put in the air to dry.

Remove Mildew from Cloth.—Put a teaspoonful of chloride of lime into a quart of water, strain it twice, then dip the mildewed places in this weak solution and lay in the sun. If not effective the first time repeat.

How to Remove a Rusty Screw.—Apply a red hot iron to the head for a short time, the screw-driver being applied immediately while the screw is hot.

Cure Mosquito Bites.—Put ten drops of refined carbolic acid into an ounce of rose water; shake well and apply (If you hold your breath while a mosquito has its bill in you it cannot withdraw it until you breathe again.) the part stained and lay on it some salt of wormwood; then rub without diluting it with more water.

MAY INCREASE
THE BRITISH
PREFERENCE

(Financial Post)

Now that Canada is to secure important trade concessions in the shape of preference at the hands of the British Government, there arises the question as to what treatment shall be accorded to British imports to Canada. In this connection the following statement to the London "Observer," by Lloyd Harris, is particularly significant in view of the fact that Mr. Harris was such an important figure in securing the concessions for Canada referred to:

Canada is anxious to foster larger trade relationships with the Motherland. For some years, as you know, we have given a substantial preference to all imported British goods. I am not without hope that it may be found possible for this preferential arrangement to be extended. Our zeal for Empire trade sets us in quest of markets in the Mother Country and her possessions. And let it be added, Canada offers large markets to British goods and enterprise.

That there will be an increase in the British preference in Canada would seem to be a logical development. In this connection interest attaches to Sir Thomas White's budget. One report is to the effect that the preference will be increased to 50 per cent., but there is nothing to indicate that this is well founded. Opinion inclines to the view that as the tendency will be to adjust the domestic tariff to the needs of the occasion rather than to make any sweeping reduction; the same tactics will be followed with regard to the British preference. An increase to a 50 per cent basis would, in the opinion of those in touch with the situation mean the ruination of a number of Canadian industries.

In Mississippi they are telling of a young lawyer retained to defend a man charged with the theft of a pig.

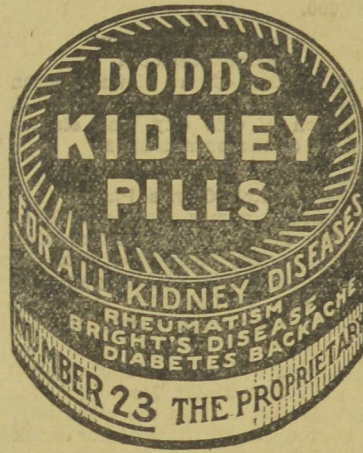
The young lawyer seemed determined to convince the jury that he was born to shine and delivered the following burst of eloquence:
