

THE RUSSIAN SITUATION IS VERY GRAVE

London, Jan. 2.—Russian affairs are causing the British Foreign Office considerable anxiety, says the Mail. The necessity of formulating a definite Allied policy as to Russia is extremely urgent, an dit has been decided that the Russian question will be the first to be discussed at the peace conference, it is said.

"It is presumed that all the Allied nations are overwhelmingly against armed intervention by an expeditionary force," says the newspaper. "The British government has also decided that an expedition is impossible, preferring to encourage the creation of a stable government in Russia, although the origin of such a government is at present quite obscure. In the meantime, munitions and instructors are being sent to the true Russian armies in the south, in Siberia and the forces on the borders of Poland and Finland. Large cargoes of food were recently sent to northern Russia for the people living in districts under Allied control. There is no likelihood of the Allied forces on the Russian coast being withdrawn."
