DEATHS IN FREDERICTON IN OFFICIAL YEAR NUMBERED 167

November and December of 1918 Had Largest Number on Account of Influenza—First and Seventh Decades of Life Had Greater Numbers of Deaths—Two Were Upwards of Ninety When They Died.

The number of deaths in the City of Fredericton between November 1st 1918 and November 1st 1919 as shown by the Board of Health permits is 167. Of these 27 died between the ages of 1 and 10; 10 between the ages of 10 and 20; 24 between the ages of 20 and 30; 14 between the ages of 30 and 40; 15 between the ages of 40 and 50; 16 between the ages of 50 and 60; 23 between the ages of 60 and 70; 22 between the ages of 70 and 80; 14 between the ages of 80 and 90 and two were over four score years and ten when called away.

By Months

These deaths occurred by months as follows:

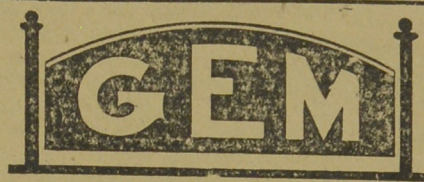
