ROLLER TOWELS.

The Argument Against the Roller Towel is That Part of It is Soiled Before the Rest.

Therefore a partly soiled roller towel must hang for several days until the cleaner parts have been used.

The argument in its favor is chiefly one of laundering. A roller towel takes less time to iron than half a dozen small towels—and at the steam laundries costs only as much as one small towel.

Towers used in the kitchen should be always rinsed in moderately cool water and then washed in hot, soapy water. Then they should be rinsed and dried in the open air. If time is at a premium, they need not be ironed. probably this laxity would shock many careful housewives, but a clean towel, dried in the open air, is quite as useful for drying dishes as one that is ironed smooth.

One clever woman saves the coarse sacks that sugar and salt comes in—the big ones. She rips the side seams and hems the ends and uses them for towels for pots and pans.

A doll's clothes line which comes with half a dozen tiny clothes pins and two small pulleys, is a convenience for drying kitchen towels. It can be fastened from the kitchen porch or door to a nearby tree and extra clothes pins can be bought for a small price.

EGGLESS PUMPKIN PIE.

Prepare your pumpkin by boiling down until almost dry. Take 1 cup of pumpkin, 2 level teaspoonsful of flour, half a teaspoon salt, half a teaspoon each of ginger and cinnamon, a small pinch of soda, half cup sugar, or, if molasses is desired then use three tablespoons of sugar and 1 tablespoon of molasses. Add two and a half cups of milk. Bake in one crust.

ODD TRIMMINGS.

Puffings make pretty, quaint trimmings for many a party frock, and are especially charming for sweet sixteen. Used in silk or ribbon about an inch wide and applied to a net or georgette frock of contrasting or deeper toned color, they are very picturesque. Some of the most up-to-date puffings are fringed—that is, the material unravelled out on both edges.

Box plaitings of silk are also fringed the same way and are good trimming for silk frocks.

Shirrings and smockings are most used on sweaters and smocks and little girls' frocks.

Covered buttons, especially the mail size, continue to be a chic trimming to the tight sleeve from the elbow to the wrist.


