Below are extracts from the annual reports of the Grand Master and Grand Secretary:

Report of Grand Master.

To the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of the Maritime Provinces of Canada.

Brothers: -In the year 1892, and again in 1901, our Grand Lodge m in this city; both were memorable events, but our present gathering promises to be the most notable in the history of our order in this juris-

diction. This year we celebrate our one hundredth anniversary. We also celebrate the restoration of peace, and in common with all loyal subjects of the British Empire and her Allies we give thanks to Almighty God for giving us the victory, and pray that He may guide and direct us in all our efforts in restoring order out of chaos. Among other events which made this year a notable one was the successful efforts of the air men in cross-

ing the Atlantic from Newfoundland to Ireland by aeroplane, also the crossing and re-crossing from England to America by dirigible airships. Another event which we are looking forward to with a great deal of inerest at this session is the vsitation of our Grand Sire, Brother Borst. This




