OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

VARIOUS TUNICS ARE WORN

Show Off the Plain Skirt and Give
That Width at Hips and Knees
Which is Demanded.

It is a wonderful time for the economists, this season. The incoming of full tunics over tight skirts gives women a chance to do that which most of them seem to enjoy—turning old frocks into new.

It has its advantages, this work, according to many women, but one cannot ignore the fact that it stands a thousand households in good stead.

There are hosts of women who prefer to bring an old gown into a new fashion rather than go to the shops and buy what they see.

Alteration amounts almost to a passion in some homes. There are trunks of debris left over from the seasons that have gone, and semi-annually this debris is dipped into, shaken out, brought into the sunshine and turned and twisted to see if it can be reassembled like broken glass and arranged into a new design.

Every season does not present opportunity for work to the woman who likes to renew frocks; this season presents the tunic, which is eagerly snatched up by a thousand or more women as an admirable chance to turn the slim gowns of last year into ones of this year.

Skirts of Two Materials.

Fashion goes even further in its generosity toward the economists than merely to provide a new contour that can be easily accomplished; it permits two materials to be used in one skirt, and if need be two colors.

It does not hold a woman to a frock of one color and one fabric. It does not demand of her hours of exhausting work in matching materials. It permits her to use a translucent tunic over an opaque skirt. It gives her full permission to drop Chinese blue over beige or tan, and even black. It allows her to use brown over black, or gray over pigeon blue.

There is no dressmaker this season who escapes the lure of combining translucent and opaque fabrics, and the home seamstress follows in her footsteps with an easy, careless swing. The fact that these two may be combined lifts a load from the mind of those who are busy replenishing the wardrobe.

A DELICATE CUSTARD.

Place one pint of milk in a mixing bowl and add two whole eggs, yolk of one egg, one teaspoon of vanilla extract, five tablespoons of sugar.

Beat with an egg beater to thoroughly mix and then pour into custard cups. Dust lightly with grated nutmeg. Place the cups in a baking pan containing cold water. Bake in the oven until firm in the centre.

To test, insert a silver knife; if no custard adheres to the knife, the custard is baked.

Use the white of an egg left over and one-half glass of jelly. Beat until the mixture holds its shape and then pile on top of the custard.

THE WESTERN LIBERALS ARE ACTIVE

Edmonton, Alta., June 13—Hundreds of Liberals from practically every section of northern Alberta yesterday assembled in five conventions representing the federal constitution of east and west Edmonton, Strathcona, Victoria and Battle River and after resolutions in every instance scoring the federal budget and affirming adherence to liberal principles and the platform laid down at the Calgary convention, delegates to the national liberal convention at Ottawa, August 5th, 6th and 8th, were selected by ballot. In but two of the ridings were Liberal candidates nominated.

The conventions were held in Edmonton, Wetaskiwin, Tofield, and Vermillion. Practically all the delegates were unanimously in favor of a grant to solidions and resolutions to this effect were passed.

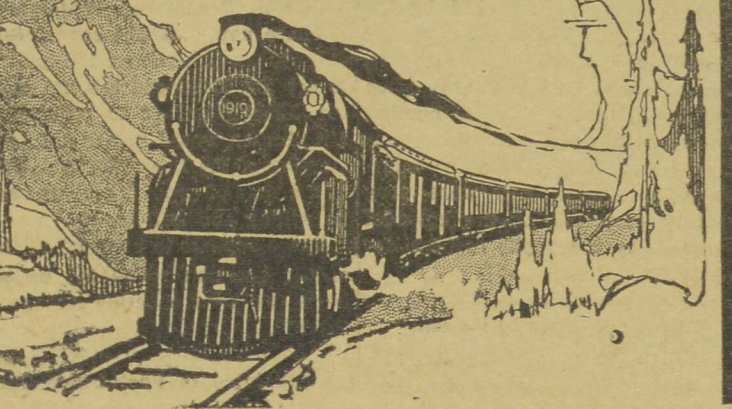
