The Lords of The Admiralty, London, have issued an order under date of October 2, that the naval flag or white ensign must not be used either ashore or afloat by any private person but must be flown only on His Majesty's ships, |naval establishments or naval barracks. This means, therefore, that any one using this flag is liable to a penalty, as it is and has always been a distinctive naval flag. The Union Jack can, of course, be flown by any one on shore.
