# OUT AND OUT PRO'S GET NO AMATEUR CARDS

President Covey Says He Must Draw Line Somewhere—Wilkie and Richardson Turned.

A. W. Covey St. John president of the Maritime Branch of the Canadian Amateur Athletic Union, is in Halifax in reference to the athletes applying for registration cards. He states that he will be fair in dealing with the cases of pros, who seek amateur cards but that he cannot allow a man who has earned a living by taking part in sport to jump back to the amateur ranks; but that in cases of athletes who were pros, only because they wanted to play in fast company he will deal leniently. Dr. Gordon Richmond or Douglas McFarlane will be appointed to deal with the reinstatement of athletes in Cape Breton.

He has refused the applications of James Wilkie and Harvey Richardson, former M. P. H. A. players who played no hockey several years previous to the outbreak of the war. He has granted cards to Foote, Os Wilkie and some others who have played in the Cape Breton league.

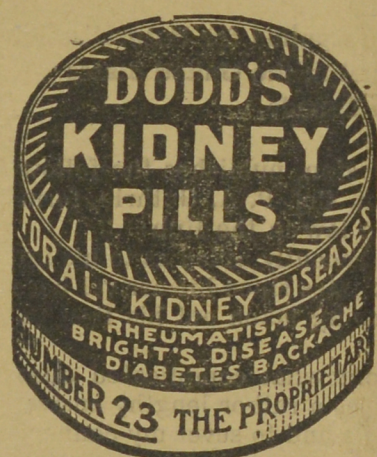

# ADIOO GUY LEADS WINNERS ON THE TWICE AROUNDS

Former Halifax Horse Won \$6,120—Unparalleled Feat on Mile Track at Lexington, Ky.

The Chicago Horse Review has a splendid photo of Adioo Guy 2.00% formerly owned by B. F. O'Neill, of Halifax, and says:

"Adioo Guy is the leading money winner of the year over the half mile tracks, with \$6,120 to his credit. His total winnings in five years amounted to \$20,465 earned in winning 35 races in 57 he has been unplaced but four times.

The Review says: "All horses now prominently before the public which have at unexpected times sprung complete surprises, never has one, figuratively speaking, so dropped from the skies with marvellous performance as has the stout-hearted chestnut pacer Adioo Guy. His showing during the season at Allerton against the famed Single G, was one of the most brilliant last quarters ever seen on a half-mile track, his time being 29 1/4, last eighth in 14 1/4, the latter being a 1.54 clip.

His first start on a mile track the past season was at Lexington, where he met the season's fastest pacer Sanardo. The latter won the first heat in the sensational time of 2.00%, while in the second Adioo Guy was away back fourth to the half and caught all the field save Sanardo and in the last eighth caught him and won in 2.00%, pacing his last half in 58 1/4 seconds, last quarter in 28 1/4.

This feat is without parallel in racing and may well constitute a world's record of its kind. There is no other instance recorded where a horse fresh from the half-mile tracks was able to carry his speed so well when first coming to the Grand Circuit. More by the luck of the race than for any other reason Sanardo won the third heat in 2.03 1/2. This race stamped Adioo Guy as one of the most remarkable pacers of this or any other year.

(Adioo Guy raced in Fredericton in July last.)

# BRYAN HAS HIS HAT IN THE RING

Washington, Dec. 29.—William J. Bryan is preparing to come into the open as a receptive candidate for the Democratic Presidential nomination, in the opinion of several Democratic leaders who received here today the latest edition of his paper, the Commoner, published in Lincoln, Neb.

The leading editorial in the Commoner is entitled "The Philistines be Upon Thee." It is printed in the first column of the first page. It calls upon the Democratic party to "be aroused by some such startling warning as that used to stir Samson to deeds of strength" and declares the Republican "reactionary" force are preparing to take advantage of the present "palated" state of the Democratic party to try for victory next year in the Presidential elections.

But the most significant thing about this edition of the Commoner is that it reprints a great many editorial references to Mr. Bryan from newspapers all over the country, in which the suggestion is made that he would be the logical man for the Democrats to nominate for the Presidency in 1920.

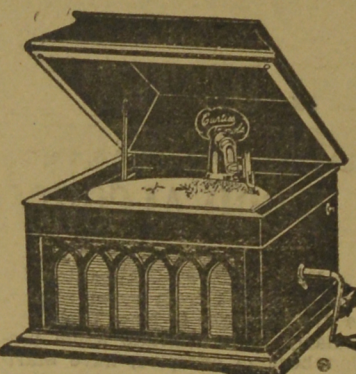

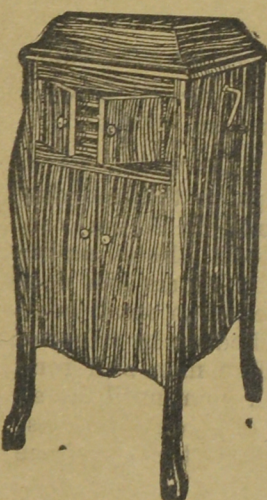
