REMEMBER BANANAS.

The saying used to go the rounds that one could live on bananas and water alone, and that if there were any one food on which man might subsist that was the banana. Recent studies in dietetics would show us that such a statement is a little far-fetched. To attempt to simplify the diet by eating bananas for breakfast, lunch and dinner, and nothing but bananas, would lead to disaster, but to use bananas more frequently than most of us do is economy both in money and in

Bananas en Casserole.

Take the peel from five or six bananas, scrape off the coarse threads and cut the banans in halves, lengthwise, and the pieces in halves crosswise Put these into a casserole; melt a small glass of currant jelly in a cup small glass of currant jelly in a cup of boiling water and pour over the bananas. Then squeeze over them the juice of half a lemon; cover the dish, and let cook in a moderate oven about half an hour. Serve from the casseole as a vegetable.

Banana Float.

Mix one and one-half tablespoonfuls of cornstarch with one and one-half cupfuls of sugar; add the yolks of four eggs and one quart of milk. Stir over slow fire until the mixture begins to of lemon extract. Take from the fire and set aside to cool. Slice four large bananas into the serving dish and pour e custard over them. WORTH REMEMBERING.
