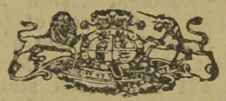

THE AFRICAN ELEPHANTS
ARE FAST DISAPPEARING

It Will be a Sad Day for Circus Men as Well as for Children and Nature Lovers When He Has Trod His Last Round Through City Streets—Passing of the Jungle and Intrusion of Cities Into Forest Lands the Cause.

(Boston Herald)

It will be a sad day for circus proprietors and owners of menageries when calls for the mighty pachyderm go out in vain. It will be a sadder day for children and nature lovers when he has trodden his last giant round through city streets and performed his farewell stunts in the enclosed ring before assembled thousands. How long will the supply of elephants last? The great-eared African species, hunted for his tusks ever since the white man entered the Dark Continent, is now well-nigh exterminated. According to a recent cablegram, this wonderful animal has practically disappeared from its old haunts in South ern Rhodesia, Cape Colony and the Eastern Transvaal. Attempts have been made to preserve the survivors of a variety that once ranged all over South Africa, but the cost of keeping them on the Addo Bush Forest Reserve proves too costly an undertaking to recommend itself to the authorities. Facing an expenditure of \$100,000 for fencing alone, to say nothing of adequate water supply and natural food, the Provincial Council of the Cape of Good Hope Province has just passed a decree ordering the destruction of the herd.

In the light of that decision naturalists are in a temper of protest, and zoologists everywhere are setting their teeth on edge. It is to them a truism that as men accumulate elephants decay; they realize that with the passing of the jungle and the relentless intrusion of cities into forest lands, the time must come sooner or later when the fate which is being meted out to the "wonder-beast" in Africa will overtake him also in his Asiatic home. "Jumbo," remember is not merely a show animal, useful only for tricks or to illustrate nature's venturesome experiments in the colossal. In India they employ him for the storing of timber and in many kinds of construction; he will deliver a load on his tusks with the faithfulness of an express company, can take up a beam and deposit it where wanted with the accuracy of a lifting crane. And you have by no means exhausted the interest in him when you have shown that he can lift heavy weights and draw immense burdens. Talk of the elephant and a note is touched that vibrates all through history. How would India's long annals have got their romance without him; whence without his contribution would have come the pomp of her barbaric courts the glitter of her processions and festivities?

In the War Game

From time immemorial the tusker has also figured in the game of war. He carried armed men, was used to break up cavalry and tramp his way through and over the foot soldiers. At times he stampeded his own line, as in the struggle between Rome and Carthage, and in the 16th century fight at Talikota between Mohammedans and Hindus. But when conditions were favorable the elephants crushed in through all opposition with irresistible force. Porus of India, defeated and captured by Alexander the Great in 326 B. C., had 700 of these living tanks in his army; Antiochus brought 54 of them into his clash with the Romans and Hannibal used 37 in his famous campaign. From an age thus ancient we have moved forward of course and from belief in the elephant's military value to the thought of his humanitarian and scientific value. A thousand stories of his sagacity and intelligence his affection and loyalty win our sympathies when we read that he will coil his trunk round a benefactor some touch of nature seems to make the whole world of life kin. And

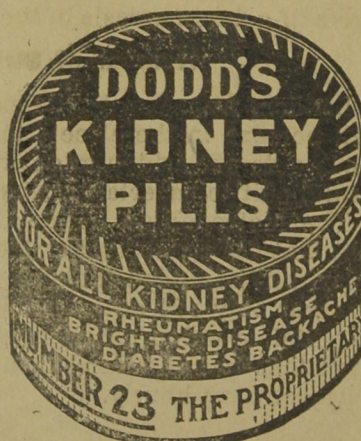
