

If Ludendorf was the ablest German LAST APPEAL general of the war, his defeat at the hands of Foch is as complete as that of any beaten general in any war. Nor is this all. If Foch's victory over Ludendorff was absolute, the successes of Petain over Falkenhayn at Verdun and of Joffre over the younger Moltke at the Marne, were only less decisive. In all three of the great tests, German generalship has succumbed to French. The legend of Sedan and Sadowa has been extinguished at the Marne and the Meuse."
