Customs Returns

Customs returns for the Port of Fredericton during November show increases in value of imports and of duty collected. The returns are: Nov. 1919—Free goods, \$9,709, Dutiable, \$121,913, Total value, \$131,622. Duty collected, \$14,410.75; Nov. 1918—Free goods, \$16,208, Dutiable, \$35,634, Total value, \$51,842, Duty collected, \$6,258.13. Increase in value of goods imported in November 1919, as compared with same month last year, \$79,780. Increase in duty collected in Nov. 1919, as compared with same month last year, \$8,152.62.

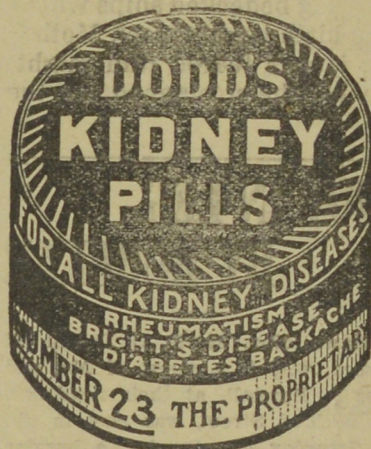
THROUGH NOON TRAIN, ST. JOHN TO HALIFAX

Nos. 13 and 14 Trains to Run
Between St. John and Halifax—To Make Boston
Connections.

Time Table changes effective on Canadian National Lines November 30 will affect St. John in one important particular. Trains Nos. 13 and No. 14, now running between St. John and Moncton, will run (daily except Sunday) between St. John and Halifax as through trains, and not connecting with the Ocean Limited at Moncton.

No. 14 will leave St. John at 1.40 p.m. after the arrival of the Boston train, carrying through Boston sleeper for Halifax, arriving there at 11.40 p.m. No. 13 will leave Halifax at 7.40 a.m. (except Sunday) and carry the through Boston sleeper to St. John, arriving at 5.35 p.m. This service should prove most satisfactory to the travelling public. A Standard C. N. R. Diner will run between Halifax and Moncton on these trains.

C. N. R. trains in and out of Fredericton are not affected by these train changes.



SONGBIRDS' SALARIES AND RISKS OF THEIR MANAGERS

(Chicago News)

Discussion of the largest salaries paid to the songbirds who come over from Europe for the grand opera seasons in New York and Chicago lends a point of interest to those of the earliest and most remarkable contracts of that kind—that between Jenny Lind, "the Swedish nightingale," and P. T. Barnum, the world's greatest showman. Barnum's capture of Jenny Lind was considered one of his greatest successes. In 1849 he first tried to induce her to come to America for a series of

concerts but at that time three concert and theatrical managers were also trying to bring her over. Barnum "ciphered and calculated" and finally resolved to offer Jenny Lind \$150,000 in good American cash for 150 concerts.

It was an amazing contract for that day and generation. Barnum not only agreed to give her \$150,000 for 150 concerts but assumed all expenses of the tour.

Many of Barnum's friends assured him that he would go broke on the enterprise. Soon after the news of the contract leaked out he was talking to a brakeman on one of the railroads, and the man said to him: "Say, Mr. Barnum is this Jenny Lind a dancer?" He confessed that his heart sank at the question. If average citizens didn't know any more of Jenny Lind than was shown by this query what was to become of his venture?

The day of days arrived when she was to sing in New York in the opening concert. Barnum had done a lot of advertising and neglected no possible means of helping along the cause. He even offered a prize for a sonnet that should properly celebrate Jenny Lind's coming to America. If I am not mistaken Bayard Taylor received the prize of \$200 for this effort.

The daring manager counted on a big house but the actual result exceeded his greatest expectations.

The concert was held at Castle Garden, and Miss Lind achieved an overwhelming artistic success. It was voted that she had the most wonderful voice ever heard on the concert stage. The place was packed and jammed and the receipts for that one concert were \$17,864.50.

On the following morning Mr. Barnum called on her and said he would carry into effect a change he had previously proposed. It was that she should continue to receive \$1,000 for each concert, besides expenses, but that after taking in \$5,500 each night for expenses and his services, the remainder should be divided between them. Jenny Lind was delighted with this unexpected offer.

The engagement was an overwhelming success. The singer earned over \$200,000 and Barnum cleaned up more than \$500,000. **GEORGE BARTON**

New Rink at Bathurst

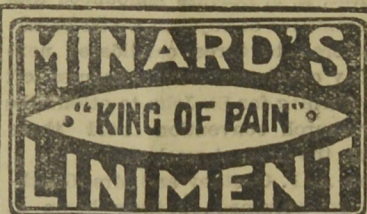
Bathurst Northern Light: Excellent progress is being made on the construction of the new hockey rink on Murray St. Extension.
