COAL SAVING.

Have weather strips on all your window casings. Put storm windows on the north and west sides of the house. The warm comfortable homes in the northwest are a great lesson in this respect.

Shut off any rooms that do not need heating. You will be just as well off without them; better, in fact, as they will then call for less work.

Sift your ashes from the stove and sift those from the furnace too. From each sifting you will get enough coal to run the furnace overnight.

Don't burn fuel in open fireplaces 90 per cent of such heat escapes up the chimney. You may love your cheery open fire. It is a sacrifice to give it up perhaps; but, compared with the sacrifices of life and love that the brave families overseas are making, it is really nothing to renounce this pleasure. Burn wood in your open fireplace when you need the cheer.

COOKING KINKS.

Flour, meal, powdered sugar and soda should be sifted before measuring. A cupful is measured level; do not shake down.

To measure a level teaspoonful or tablespoonful, make smooth with a knife, but do not pat down.

To broil steak, see that the fire is bright and clear, put the steak on the gridiron, turn often and allow time according to the thickness of the steak; dust with salt and pepper and serve very hot.

HOUSEHOLD REMINDERS.

To clean burnt aluminum ware use hot vinegar and salt.

When beef looks as if it going to be tough, rub it with a slice of lemon.

Oilcloth tacked on bottom of footstools makes them slide easier.

If a teaspoonful of mutton tallow is added to starch when boiling it will prevent iron from sticking and also give a gloss to clothes.

Cream which is too thin to whip may be made to do so by the addition of an unbeaten white of egg.

Meat should never be put in cold water except in making soup, as cold water draws out the juices.

Flour, meal, powdered sugar and soda should be sifted before measuring. A cupful is measured level; do not shake down.

Delicious sandwich filling is made by running through the meat chopper half of a Spanish onion and one small green pepper. Mix a cream cheese with salt and paprika and add to the chopped mixture to form a paste which should be spread on thin slices of bread.

To preserve fresh apples, use dry sand which has been heated and cooled again. Cover bottom of stone jar with sand, put in one layer of apples, having the fruit about one-half inch apart, cover with the sand, put in another layer of apples, and so on till the jar is full. The jar must be closed airtight and kept in a cool place. The sand will keep the apples dry and preserve the flavor.

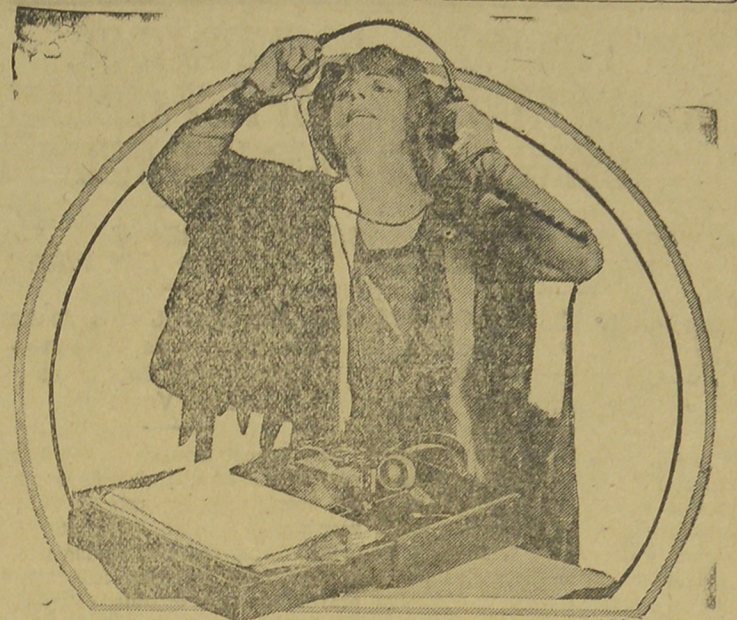
MR. TAFT AT ST. CATHERINES

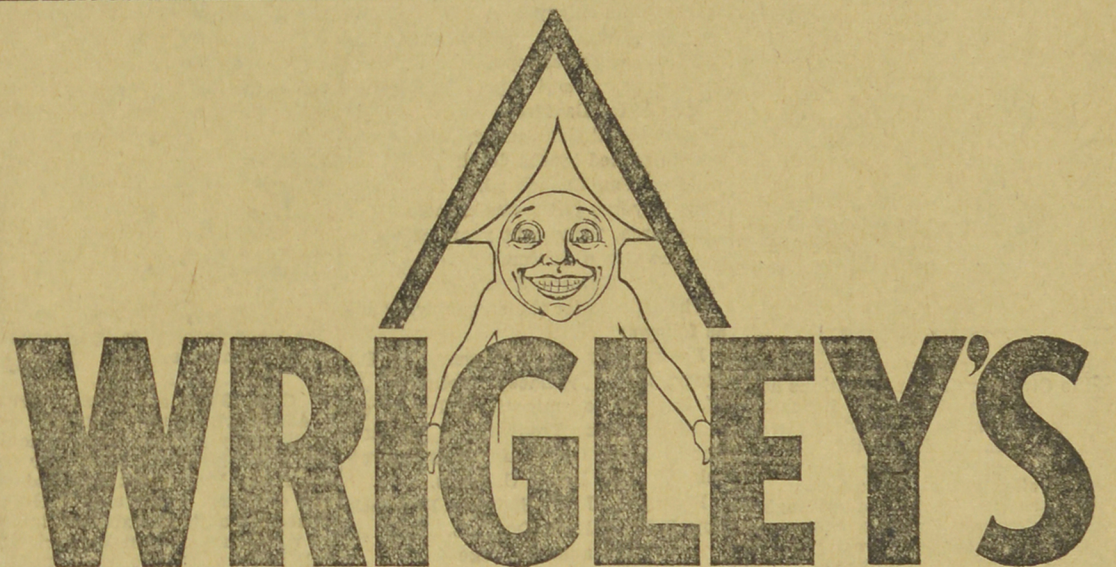

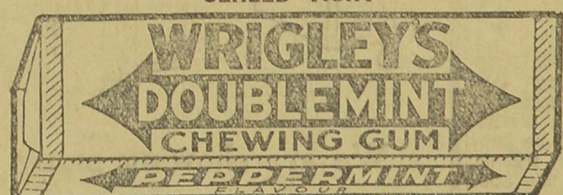

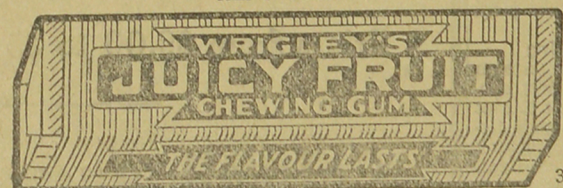
