

# HOW THE WAR MAY AFFECT THE HIRED MAN PROBLEM IN AMERICA

Not long ago, remarks a New England paper, the fact that many, perhaps a large majority of the soldiers that won honorbeen exchanged for a War Savings able fame for Canada and the United States on the battlefields of France, were looking forward to working for themselves rather than for hire, when they returned to civil life, was commented upon by many writers.

If this situation has really attained the magnitude that it seems to have reached, the future of agriculture in this country demands some serious consideration. The problem of farm help has long been perplexing, and for several years before the complications of war the perplexity had been increasing. At present many rather indierent workers are engaged for the farming season of eight months for around \$50 a month and their board, lodging and washing. Considering the present eost of living, this is practically equal to \$100 a month in the city. As a sort of parenthetical thought it may be said that when the subject of farm labor is mentioned the workers lose sight of the fact that the wages generally include board and lodging and look only at the cash in hand wage, which is not fair.
