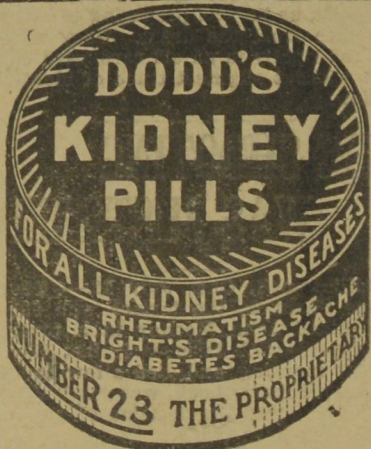

THE FISHERIES BROUGHT N.F.L. THROUGH WAR

St. John's, Nfld., July 22.—Newfoundland's great fishing industry was the means of bringing the colony through the war financially unscathed. Estimates made public today indicated that notwithstanding generous provision for all public services, the surplus revenue for the year ended June 30th would be at least \$2,160,000, or nearly double the surplus of the year previous, and three times that of 1916-17. Every attempt will be made to develop further the world market for the fishery products, but the return of pre-war fishing activities in Europe is expected to put an end to the trade advantage enjoyed by Newfoundland during the past five years.

RACE RIOTS IN THE SOUTH

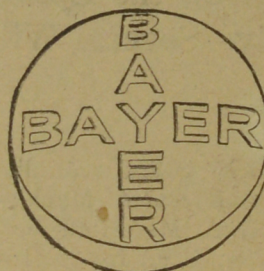

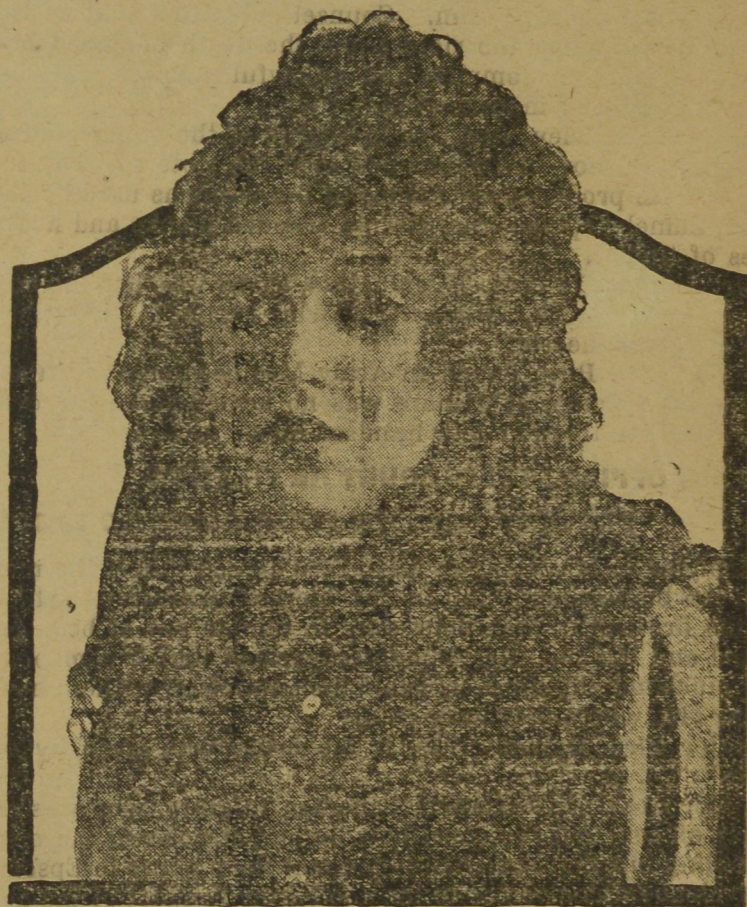
