SAVS SENATE PROCLAIMED ITS OWN USELESSNESS

An Ontario Paper Makes Slashing Attack on the Upper House
—Prohibition Bills Were Sent Up at the Eleventh Hour,
When There was No Time for Consideration---Senators
Took Fright at a Plank in the Platform of the Farmers.

(Woodstock, Ont., Sentinel-Review)

The action of the Senate in passing both prohibition measures sent up from the Commons derives special significance from the circumstances under which it was taken. The bill were sent up at the end of the session. There was no time for proper consideration. They had been rushed through the House of Commons by the power of the Government's majority. The hour for prorogation had been fixed. The Senate was practically told that it must either accept them or reject them within a given time. It is quite evident from what little consideration the measures received in the Senate that the dose was not entirely palatable. There must have been many of the Senators to whom the measures on their merits, were not acceptable, but what was especially objectionable was the attempt to rush them through at the last minute. Some of the members had the courage to voice this objection; but the cry was raised that a strong wave of sentiment was sweeping over the country and that the Senate itself might be swept away if it exposed itself to the danger. Warning was given that there was a plank in the platform of the United Farmers for the abolition of the Senate, and that the Senators could not afford to thwart the people's will. In a word, the senate took fright.

Safety First

This is the feature of the situation which deserves to be emphasized. The Senate in its solicitude for its own safety proclaimed its own justification for the existence of a body like the Senate in a democratic country like Canada, it is that it may stand between the people and their own over-hasty and impulsive decisions. The members of the House of Commons are elected; they are directly responsible to their constituents. They are at the mercy of any wave of popular sentiment that may arise. The members of the Senate are not elected; they are not responsible in the sense in which the members of the Commons are responsible. They occupy a privileged position, and the special service which they are expected to render in return for their privilege is to save the country from ill-considered legislation and give the people the benefit of a second thought. When the Senate confesses its inability to discharge such a duty it confesses its uselessness. When the Senate yields to popular clamor for the sake of protecting itself; it proclaims to the country that it is no longer worthy of protection. Its usefulness is gone.

One of the most difficult of all the problems of democracy is to secure protection for the rights of minority against the tyranny of the majority. Another and kindred problem is to protect the majority against the consequences of its own unreasoning impulse. A tyrannical majority is even more unbearable than an absolute Kaiser. It is always possible for the people to rise against an individual tyrant; but it is exceedingly difficult to contend against a great majority. And so it is that thoughtful men at all times, when charged with the responsibility of framing constitutions, have sought by various means to provide machinery for protecting minorities, on the one hand, and for saving majorities from their own excesses on the other. People who talk light-heartedly of the right of the majority to rule, do so for the most part unthinkingly. When they happen to be in the minority themselves and begin to feel the tyranny of mere numbers, they realize there is another side the question. Supposing the Catholic majority of Quebec were to decide as the result of a referendum that the preaching and teaching of Protestant doctrines in

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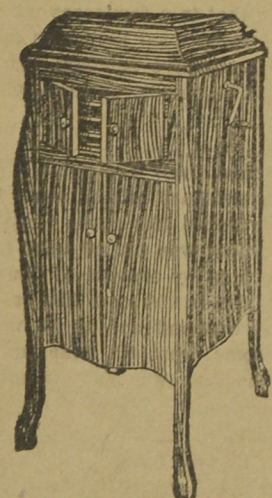
