BOOZE MEN

Montreal, Dec. 24.—The twelve legal vendors of spirituous liquors in Montreal are in a melancholy frame of mind. Apparently they are the only section of the population who will not gain by the repeal of the War Measures order-in-council. The vendors' rights will remain as before, but with the opening of inter-provincial traffic in liquor, their trade will cut a sorry figure in competition with the widened insurance, powers of the importers.

The importers, after the New Year, can sell just as many bottles as are ordered to any man who likes to say that he is buying them for a friend in Ontario." They are under no obligation to ship the order to Ontario themselves, and only need the verbal assurance that it is bought for an Ontario customer. On the other hand, the vendor can sell only one bottle at a time and that only upon the presentation of a medical prescription.
