

## HOUSEHOLD WISDOM.

## The Art of Making Coffee.

Percolators have solved the question of making good coffee, because with these coffee is made and the grounds thrown out automatically and they do not stand in the liquor. If you have no percolator, put your coffee in a bag and, after making, lift this out of the pot and there will be no stale taste to the coffee when you reheat it for a late arrival.

If you use a percolator or bag you should have your coffee pulverised instead of merely ground. This is a great saving. No egg is necessary to settle the coffee if it is made by this method.

The proper proportion for an average cup of coffee is one level teaspoon to each cup wanted, and one extra spoonful for the pot. This means pulverized coffee. Pour boiling water over it, settle with a dash of cold water and serve at once.

## When Ironing.

When preparing to iron, place on the ironing board or table near at hand a small bowl of warm water, a cake of white soap a small dish of peroxide, and one of cornmeal, together with a perfectly clean toothbrush and a soft, white cloth.

If you find a spot has been left on some article by line or clothespin, dip the brush into the water, then over the soap, then rub a few times over the soiled spot, which usually disappears. If the spot is on something starched, where water would affect the stiffness, try the cornmeal, rubbing it over the soiled place briskly with the dry brush or with the end of a Turkish towel or any rough surface. The peroxide use in case of scorch dipping the white cloth in it and rubbing over the scorched spot. Repeat if necessary, but usually one application will do the work, the warm iron removing the last traces.

## School Frocks.

For the little girl's school frock the pongee guimpe recommends itself to the careful mother, and these pongee guimpes may be made at home without difficulty. They are worn with frocks of navy blue serge or with corduroy frocks and appear fresh longer than the white cotton guimpe, but go through the laundry quite as well.

Some are made in pongee colored silk.

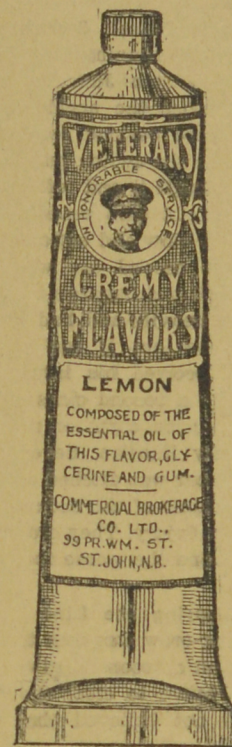
