

OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

IRISH AND OTHER LACES.

Revival of Popularity is Hailed by Wise Women on This Side of the Atlantic.

Just why Irish lace has been revived it would be hard to say; but whenever it is revived there are a good many women who rejoice, for it is a lace that always has many admirers on this side of the Atlantic.

When a woman invests \$30 or \$40 in Irish lace she has something quite tangible to show for it, for the most casual observer can tell the "real" from the imitation, while with some of the other laces only one who is something of an expert could tell the difference between the "real" and a very good imitation. Besides, Irish lace is extremely substantial. It is not worn out in a single season, and it can be restored to its original freshness by the professional cleaners without a lot of trouble or expense.

Now, as it is being used this season, there is nothing of that harshness that was sometimes characteristic of the way it was used a dozen years ago, when it was so greatly in vogue. It is very often combined with a fine Valenciennes or imitation Valenciennes. This is especially true when it is used in blouses or on jabots or other neck fixings. Then again, it is simply combined with footings—that is, insertion consisting simply of fine net.

White frocks of wash material, whether in fact they are ever laundered or are sent to the dry cleaner to be freshened—are to be worn a great deal more this summer than has been the case in any summer since the war began. And these frocks are going to be simple lace trimmed affairs, many of them, whose sole trimming is to consist of yards and yards of insertion combined with white organdie or lawn or voile. And some of the most effective of these will be the ones that make free use of Irish insertion and edging.

WHAT COOKS SHOULD KNOW.

Do you know that melted butter should be rubbed on clean potatoes when they are to be baked? This keeps the skin from getting thick and hard.

If soup must be served as soon as it is made, and there is no time to let the grease harden, a piece of ice should be put into it and then taken out again; then remove the grease that has hardened on it, put in again and repeat until the grease has all hardened on the piece of ice.

The saucepan in which macaroni is to be cooked should be buttered. This will prevent the macaroni from sticking.

Dried bread crumbs absorb more liquid and therefore are better for a moist dish, but crumbs grated or crumbled from a fresh loaf take a lighter more delicate color and are better, therefore for a dainty dish.

Always, when mixing a milk mixture with another, the other mixture should be poured over the milk. This prevents curdling. For instance, in mixing tomato and milk, add the tomato to the milk. In mixing meat stock with cream sauce, pour the meat stock into the other. Add also a small pinch of soda.

Meat should never be pierced while it is cooking, thus allowing the juices to escape.

When you wish to cut thin slices of bread you should heat a steel knife over the fire to do it with.

After cleaning lettuce and celery they should be wrapped in a damp cloth and placed directly on the ice for half an hour or longer to become crisp.

Mayonnaise, butter, milk, cream and cheese should all be kept closely covered, as they readily absorb odors from other foods.

As soon as macaroni has been drained and blanched by throwing in into cold water, it should be mixed with a little butter to keep it from sticking together.


