



Useful Fruit from Which Many Summer Desserts Can be Made.

Bananas are as useful a fruit as man is blessed with. They are ever ripe and ever cheap. They vary little in flavor and texture, for they are always good. They can be prepared in rich and highly seasoned dishes that satisfy the appetite on a crisp day of winter, or they can be made into light and appetizing dishes that suit the taste of summer.

Banana blanc mange is a good summer day dessert that is easy to make. To prepare it, heat a quart of milk in a double boiler with a quarter of a cupful of sugar. Add four tablespoon fuls of cornstarch rubbed smooth in a little milk. Remove from the fire when it is thick and when it is partly cool add two sliced bananas and a teaspoonful of vanilla. Mold and chill and serve with cream or boiled custard.

Banana custard is made in this way: Beat three eggs with half a cupful of sugar and add two cups of milk, the grated rind of a lemon and enough banana pulp mashed to make a thin batter. Bake until it is set in a moderate oven, then cover with a merthe custard.
