



Stevens, head of the Devere Aviation School Limited accompanied by Lieutenant Stevenson of Charlottetown, the school representative in Prince Edward Island, flew from Truro to Charlottetown Wednesday to fulfill an agreement with the provincial exhibition which opened there. The two birdmen left at ten minutes past twelve and were in Charlottetown fifty-five minutes later. making the trip in less than a mile a minute. They carried with them a let ter from Mayor Coffin of Truro to the mayor of Charlottetown. This is the first flight ever made over Northumberland strait and the first airplane ever seen in Prince Edward Island. Captain Stevens will return to Trurc on Saturday afternoon.
