

The Revival of Paisley.

Three or four seasons ago Paisley was revived, and many were the fine old shawls restored from the seclusion of darkness of some old chest or attic to be cut up into fashionable accessories. Quite large sums were offered by some of the smart dressmakers who were making use of genuine Paisley for the trimming of frocks in combination with fur, in scarfs and muffs for handbags and on hats. Fad for Pieced Furs.

For instance a sealskin coat showed a collar of skunk or chinchilla. But this year there is the most unexpected sort of combination of two furs that you would never have thought of using together, and all within the small compass of a small collar or scarf. It might look, if you didn't know, as if the furriers were trying to use up small bits of fur that they had on hand, or as if some thrifty woman who wore them had two partly worn out pieces and had one good piece made from the better parts of both. But that is not at all what has happened. It is distinctly the fad to have these patchwork pieces of fur and the odder the combination the better fashion likes it.

Pongee Guimpes.

For the little girl's school frock the pongee guimp recommends itself to the careful mother, and these pongee guimpes that are offered at some of the high price specialty shops for children may be made at home without difficulty. They are worn with frocks of navy blue serge or with corduroy frocks and appear fresh longer than the white cotton guimpes, but go through the laundry quite as well. Some of them are made in pongee colored silk.


Fringed Hats.

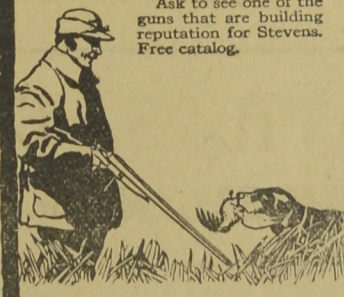

ONTARIO'S
PROBLEM NOT
YET SOLVED

Toronto, Ont. 22.—That Hartley Dewart, leader of the liberals in the new Ontario legislature, will be called on to form a provincial government but that Hon. Adam Beck, defeated independent conservative in London, and Chairman of the Provincial Hydra Commission, will be the next Premier on Ontario, seems to be the most popular opinion here today among fairly well informed people, discussing the much mixed political situation in this province.

This is assuming that Sir Wm. Hearst, whose government, was defeated on Conday, and who is meeting with his cabinet today, decides to hand in the resignation of himself and Ministers to the Lieutenant-Governor, Sir John Hendrie. This action is naturally expected, as the position of the government has grown worse, in the matters of supporters during the last 24 hours, by the news of the reversal in South Grey, where it is now conceded that Hon. Dr. Jamieson, Speaker in the last house, has been defeated by G. M. Leeson, United Farmers' candidate, according to complete figures. This gives the U. F. O. forty-five straight members in the House of 111 seats, and if they combine with the labor delegation of eleven members, and the one soldier and one independent Liberal, the Farmers coalition would have a majority of five over all others in the house.

Will Call on Dewart.

However, it is conceded generally today that the Lieutenant-Governor, constitutionally, would have the right to call on Hartley Dewart, the leader of the last "official" opposition in the house to form a new government, although his Liberal following in the newly elected house is second to the L. F. O. in numbers.



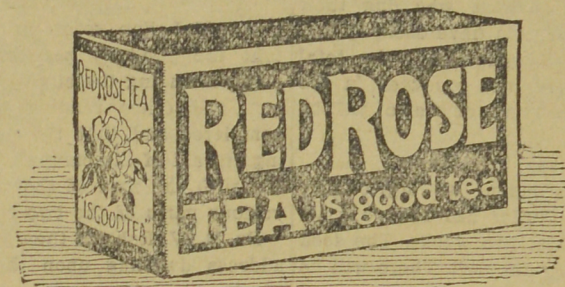

drie, Lieutenant-Governor, in reply to criticism made by Mr. Dewart in reference to a statement made by Sir John yesterday, said: "Why should Mr. Dewart think he is not the man I will call on to form a government. The Government has to be carried on, however, by some body at present outside the elected house, if he cannot be found among the already elected members."

May Choose Beck.

Unless Mr. Dewart can form a coalition, which hardly seems likely, the Lieutenant-Governor will then probably call on the leader of the United Farmers, and it would be no surprise to many people if the farmers, at their convention here this afternoon choose as their leader Sir Adam Beck.

The situation regarding the United Farmers so far as could be gathered from conversations with U. L. O. delegates before they met today in convention, seemed to favor the creation of a coalition government with the U. F. O. in control, under a strong leader. Leaders of the farmers today stated that conferences had been held with Sir Adam Beck on the subject and their report was to be made to the convention this afternoon.

Standing of Parties.

Revised standing of new Ontario legislature follows:

U. F. O. 45; Liberals 28; Conservatives 25; Labor 11; Soldier 1; Independent-Liberal 1. Total 111.

U. F. O. list includes two candidates endorsed by labor, one endorsed by liberals, and one endorsed by labor, and veterans. Labor list includes two also endorsed by U. F. O.
