to \$75,000. Small amounts were due from the operating department of the \$7,200, and from the Dominion subsidy there was due \$126,413.09. In addition there was \$8,550 from the Provincial Trust Company, applicable to that section, which items would reduce the estimated cost of completion by \$201,377, leaving approximately \$90,000 chargeable to capital account for the completion of the road. The total cost of the road should be understood to include the Dominion subsidy, which naturally in any final accounting as to the share of the province, would be deducted. The Dominion subsidies amounted to a little over \$1,000,000. The following would show the cost of the road to March 1st and the possible requirements to complete.

Exceeded the Estimate
With respect to revenue the total receipts of the province last year amounted to \$2,323,633.03, an increase of \$187,852.88 over the estimated amount. The Dominion subsidy had yielded \$637,976.16; Territorial Revenue was \$799,657.80, which was an increase of \$109,657.80 over the estimate. The wild lands and forest tax were responsible for a large measure of the increase. Fees from the Provincial Secretary's office were \$21,831.01, or \$831.01 over the estimate; taxes on incorporated companies totalled \$75,733.81 an increase of \$4,236.81; the Amusement Tax yielded \$16,997.82 in four months, or \$11,997.82 over the estimate. The Motor Vehicle Tax amounted to \$90,188.58 the same as estimated. The grant of \$25,000 from the Federal Government had been of much assistance in carrying on the greater production campaign in the province. The receipts from the sale of seed totaled \$173,080.34; that amount of course had been offset by a similar amount on the disbursement side. In regard to greater production he wished to say that too much credit could not be given to various county councils for their hearty co-operation with the Department in the distribution of seed. Conditions in regard to seed which had existed in 1917 were now reversed and the province was now ready to export a surplus.

Potato Assessment
The Patriotic and War Purpose assessment tax had amounted to \$99,079.99. In regard to that tax he wished to contradict the statement that the money had been improperly used in other directions. Payments made out of the fund had included: Interest on patriotic potato bond issue, \$6,000; Halifax relief grant, \$10,000; ditto, Public Works Department, \$1,003; Grant Returned Soldiers Commission \$3,000; Grant Great War Veterans Association, \$4,000; Food Controller, \$1,605; Guard Duty, Parliament Build-

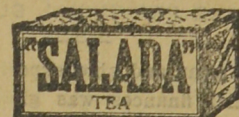
