THE CHEMISE BLOUSE.

The Latest Thing in the Way of a
Shirt Waist.

Far from going out of fashion, as the blouse seemed to threaten to do with the advent of the one piece dress it has become even more popular than ever. From the rather grotesque and overtrimmed boned and stayed dress waist of many years ago, we have gradually simplified it with the general simplification of the fashionable figure until what is called a dress blouse of today is really the upper section of a costume designed to carry out the one piece idea. They hang to the knees or just touch the hips, but no self-respecting blouse will be caught up to the waist line, which, by the way, isn't being used any longer. If there must be a waist line, it should do something extraordinary to excuse its presence, the newest thing being to the natural waist line in front and lower in the back and with most of the fullness behind.

Even with suits where the regular shirt waist is worn, unless the coat buttons up tight there is the vest to cover the top of the skirt and it certainly improves the line of the figure.

Color Combination.

One of the rules of composition used by artists may be applied very successfully in dividing the costume into light waists with dark skirts. On a well-dressed woman there should be some arrangement of the waist or skirt to keep the eye from "stopping" at the waist line, some overlapping of one of the colors over the other, an irregular waist line or a sash.

One of the most successful ways of evading the waist line is the chemise blouse—the newest version of the peplum. Some of the smartest of these hang loose all around like a short smock, but these are only good for the slight figure—for a stouter figure a clever arrangement is to have only a front panel left loose or a belt run through slits holding the waist tight in front, sides and back, leaving two panels loose between the sides and front, thus the long lines are carried out without sacrificing the trimness of the figure.

SEASONABLE RECIPES.

Stuffed Prunes.

Steam prunes until tender, but not broken; then pit and fill cavities thus formed with chopped nuts, raisins or dates. Return the liquor drained from fruit to the fire, boil and stir into it one-third box gelatine dissolved in a quarter cup of cold water. Pour this around the prunes, then stand in a cold place to harden. Serve with sweetened cream.

Apple Charlotte.

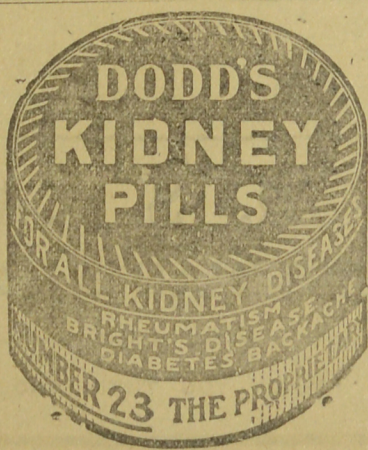
Take two quarts of diced apples, a cup of sugar, a teaspoonful of cinnamon, one cup of seeded raisins, a half-cup of currants, one lemon, rind and juice. Line a pudding dish with a rich pie crust. Fill with the chopped apples, sugar and other ingredients and steam or bake until done.

Corn and Oysters.

One can of corn, a half cup of flour, a half teaspoon of butter, one egg, salt and pepper to taste. Mix and beat all together. Fry in butter or drippings about the size of an oyster.

Potato Scallop.

Peel and slice raw potatoes thin. Butter a baking dish and put in potatoes. Before putting in oven, pour over hot milk to cover, thickened with two tablespoons butter and one of flour, seasoned with salt and pepper. If you care to, you can put the seasoning between layers of potato.

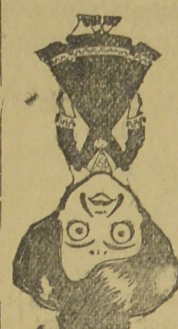
Everything Happy-Go-Lucky
