Sudden illness sometimes demands invalid food that can be quickly made. And when a housewife must play the part of nurse, quickly and easily made invalid dishes are again in demand. Broth.

This is the easiest sort of beef or mutton broth: Put one pound of lean with a pint of cold water and let it stand fifteen minutes. Then boil it slowly for thirty minutes and strain it. Season it and serve it very hot.

Rice Muffins.

Place in a mixing bowl one egg, two of shortening, one teaspoon of salt, cup of milk, one and a half cups of flour, four teaspoons of baking pow der, one cup of cold boiled rice. Beat hard to thoroughly mix and then pour When You Hear the Alarm, Look for in well-greased muffin pans. Bake 20 minutes in a hot oven.

Indian Griddle Cakes.

One cup of cornmeal, one cup of flour, one teaspoon of salt, three level teaspoons of baking powder, two tablespoons of sirup, one tablespoonful of shortening, one egg, one and a quarter cups of milk. Beat hard to mix and then bake on hot griddles.

Louisiana Corn Bread.

Place in mixing bowl three-quarters cup of cornmeal, one and one-quarter cups of flour, one teaspoon of salt, five level teaspoons of baking powder, two tablespoons of shortening, four tablespoons of syrup, one egg, one and a


