It is quite possible that he may seek election in Prince Edward Island. Though the county of South Renfrew which brought Hon. Geo. P. Graham to the house after his defeat in 1911, is being canvassed by prominent Liberals of the county on Mr. King's behalf The resignation of J. E. Pedlow, the sitting member would, however, have

to be secured. Apart from the election of Mr. King he opposition has not much at stake. It is not believed that they will place




