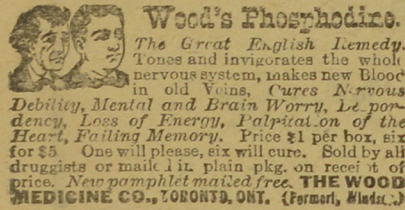

## TABLE OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

4 teaspoons of a liquid equal 1 table spoon.  
4 tablespoons of a liquid equal ½ gill or ¼ cup.  
½ cup equals 1 gill.  
2 gills equal one cup.  
2 cups equal 1 pint.  
2 pints (4 cups) equal 1 quart.  
4 cups of flour equal 1 pound, or 1 quart.  
2 cups of butter, solid, equals 1 lb.  
½ cup of butter, solid, equals ¼ lb. or 4 ounces.  
2 cups of granulated sugar equal 1 lb.  
2½ cups of powdered sugar equal 1 lb.  
1 pint of milk or water equals 1 lb.  
1 pint of chopped meat equals 1 lb.  
10 eggs, shelled, equal 1 pound.  
4 tablespoons of flour equal 1 ounce.  
8 eggs with shells equal 1 pound.  
2 tablespoons of butter equal 1 ounce.  
2 tablespoons of granulated sugar equal 1 ounce.  
4 tablespoons of butter equal 2 ounces or ¼ cup.  
4 tablespoons of coffee equal 1 ounce.  
1 tablespoon of liquid equals a half-

## TIME FOR BAKING.

Beans—8 to 10 hours.  
Beef—Sirloin, rare, per lb., 8 to 10 minutes; well done, per lb., 12 to 15 minutes; rolled rib or rump, per lb., 12 to 15 minutes; long or short fillet, 20 to 30 minutes.  
Bread—Medium loaf, 40 to 60 min.  
Cake—Plain, 20 to 40 minutes.  
Biscuit—10 to 20 minutes.  
Sponge Cake—45 to 60 minutes.  
Chickens—3 to 4 lbs weight, 1 to one and a half hours.  
Cookies—10 to 15 minutes.  
Custards—15 to 20 minutes.  
Duck (stuffed)—40 to 60 minutes.  
Fish—6 to 8 lbs., 1 hour.  
Gingerbread—20 to 30 minutes.  
Graham Gems—30 minutes.  
Lamb—Well done, per lb., 15 min.  
Mutton—Rare, per lb., 10 minutes, well done, per lb., 15 minutes.  
Pie crust—30 to 40 minutes.  
Pork—Well done, per lb., 30 min.  
Potatoes—30 to 45 minutes.  
Pudding—Bread, rice and tapioca, 1 hour; plum, 2 to 3 hours.  
Rolls—10 to 15 minutes.  
Turkey—70 lbs., 3 hours.  
Veal—Well done, per lb., 20 minutes

## BRIEF BUT USEFUL RECIPES.

Restore Gilt Frames.—Rub with a sponge moistened with turpentine.  
Drive Away Anns.—A little quick lime placed in the infested places.  
Remove Tar from Cloth.—Rub it well with turpentine till every trace is removed.  
Make Leather Waterproof.—Saturate it with castor oil; to stop shoes squaking, drive a peg into the middle of the sole.  
Clean the Hair.—Wash well with a mixture of soft water, 1 pint; sal soda 1 ounce; cream tartar ¼ ounce.  
Egg Stains on Spoons.—Rub with common salt.  
Clean Gloves.—Pour a little benzine into a basin and wash the gloves in it, rubbing and squeezing them until clean. If much soiled, they must be washed again through clean benzine and rinsed in a fresh supply.  
Hang in the air to dry.  
Clean Hair Brushes.—Dissolve a little soda in warm water and pour in a small amount of ammonia. Hold the brushes with the bristles downward and avoid wetting the back as far as possible; shake until the grease is removed; then rinse in cold water and put in the air to dry.  
Remove Mildew from Cloth.—Put a teaspoonful of chloride of lime into a quart of water, strain it twice, then dip the mildewed places in this weak solution and lay in the sun. If not effective the first time repeat.  
How to Remove a Rusty Screw.—Apply a red hot iron to the head for applied immediately while the screw is hot.  
Cure Mosquito Bites.—Put ten drops of refined carbolic acid into an ounce of rose water; shake well and apply. (If you hold your breath while a mosquito has its bill in you it cannot withdraw it until you breathe again).

## AROUND THE CITY

Time works great changes not only in men but in places. Who would have thought a few years ago that an unprotected and unguarded barrel of booze would lie all day on Regent Street and never be interfered with. Just such a thing happened the other day, according to the statement of the wise ones. They—the wise ones—say that the barrel made its appearance mysteriously early in the morning and disappeared just as mysteriously after nightfall. Passersby examined the barrel, smelled it, rolled it, and were convinced that it contained something with a kick. But no person would try to take it away. One professional man is said to have got his courage to the point where he attempted to get a teamster to take it away, but there was nothing doing as far as the teamster was concerned. Every one felt positive that the barrel was a "plant"—that just as soon as any thrifty person got it in his possession a sub-inspector would appear as mysteriously as had the barrel, and make an arrest and a seizure. Rumor has it that the barrel was thrown from a motor vehicle early in the morning, the driver not having sufficient nerve to "carry on". However that may be, the barrel disappeared at night and it is supposed that the rightful owner "took a chance". But what a change. What chance would a lonely barrel of booze have had in the Regent Street of a few years ago? O tempora! O mores!

Citizens slightly beyond middle age can tell of wild scenes witnessed in the Regent Street of years ago. "Them was the happy days!" Before the measure variously known as the Scott Act and the Canada Temperance Act was passed to make it a little more difficult for the thirsty individual to slake his drouth, licensed bars abounded there as they did in other sections of the city. Rattling of logs at Douglas by combined effort on the part of the operators following the Corporation Drive was not practised and the driving crews brought their logs right down to Fredericton, and here they were paid off.

Abundant money in those days meant abundant liquor and liquor meant fights. In the old days the river drivers paid but scant attention to the police and any row no matter how general, went its full course. The result was that Regent Street was avoided by all peaceably inclined citizens. Now everything is changed. Regent street is an ordinary street with that part of it formerly famed for disturbances, devoted to the ordinary devices of trade and business.

Real estate which has been rather quiet in Fredericton since the beginning of the war, is showing activity. It appears that some citizens have sufficient optimism to prepare for the development which is likely to come in this city in the near future. Fredericton's business section which a few years ago was confined almost exclusively to Queen Street now includes portions of King Street and is steadily expanding south along the cross-streets. The location of the Union Station which it is confidently expected will be erected within a few years to meet increasing railway requirements, will have much to do in determining the section of the city in which real estate activity will display

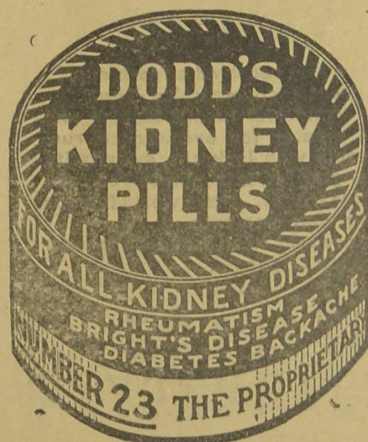

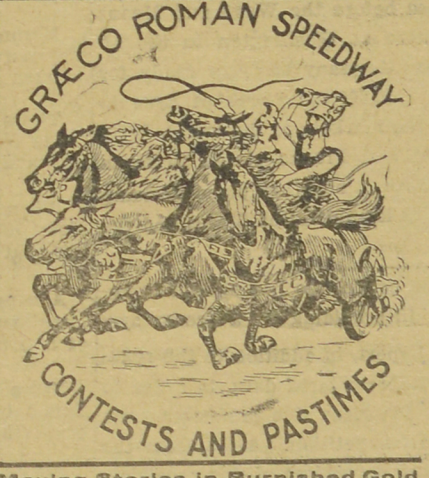
