OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

WHEN EGGS ARE MINUS.
We Often Say We Would Rather Eat No Cake Than Eggless Cake.

Still, we feel once in a while a craving for cake when we really don't feel that we can afford to use more than one egg at the most. The next time you feel this craving try one of the following recipes:

One pound of seeded raisins, three tablespoonfuls butter, two teaspoonfuls cinnamon, two cups sugar, one teaspoonful allspice, one cup water, a cup of brown coffee, one egg, three cups flour, two tablespoonfuls baking powder.

Place in a large bowl the raisins, butter, cinnamon, sugar and allspice. Mix these ingredients well, adding gradually one cup of water and one cup of brown coffee. The latter gives the cake a rich brown color. Boil this mixture for five minutes and set it aside. When cool, add the egg, flour and baking powder. Mix all together thoroughly and put it into a well buttered pan. Have ready a warm oven and bake three-quarters of an hour.

A Good No-Egg Cake.

Cream one cup of sugar and butter size of an egg together and stir well. Next add cup of milk. Mix three teaspoons of baking powder with two heaping cups of flour and a little salt. Beat light and add any flavoring. Bake in a loaf or in two Washington pie plates and put together with any filling you like.

Mixture can be divided, add three tablespoonfuls cocoa to half the mixture and bake like marble cake.

Add cocoa to one-half of the mixture and bake two pie-plates of light and one of dark.

Put a little less butter, four tablespoonfuls cocoa and bake in loaf for a nice chocolate cake. Add spice, two tablespoonfuls of molasses and fruit for a dark cake.

Bathing is now something much different from what it was not many years ago. In favorable weather bathers may be seen, especially in the afternoon and early evening, at the West End beach, the A. & B. Club House and along Waterloo Row. The civic authorities encourage swimming although not to the extent of putting the city bathing houses into commission promptly. In former days bathing was confined to the "Gully" in the extreme west and the "Flats" in the extreme east and the majority of bathers considered costume entirely superfluous. On that account bathing in the more densely inhabited parts of the city was confined to the hours of the night or early morning. If the civic authorities encourage swimming selves at all with the matter it was to discourage bathing. Nowadays women and girls form a large minority of the bathers and the number of swimmers in Fredericton's population is greatly increased.

RECIPE FOR SUGAR COOKIES.

1 cup shortening, 1 cup sugar, 1 tablespoonful milk, 1 egg, 2 tablespoonfuls baking powder, quarter teaspoon salt, flavoring, two cups of flour.

Cream butter, sugar and egg yolks; add flour, baking powder, salt, milk and white of egg, beaten to a stiff froth. If not of the consistency to roll add a little more flour. Roll on a floured board, sprinkle with granulated sugar and cut with a cookie cutter. Bake ten minutes.

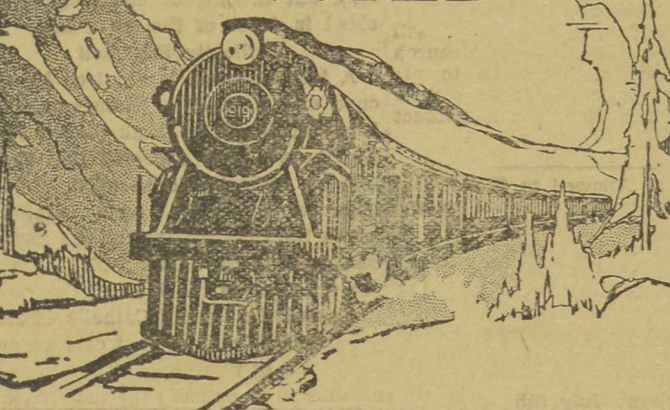
