





HOUSEKEEPERS' HANDY REFERENCE

BRIEF BUT USEFUL RECIPES.

Restore Gilt Frames.-Rub with a Beef-Siloin, rare, per lb., \$ to 10 minutes; well done, per lb., 12 to 15 minutes; rolled rib or rump, per lb., sponge moistened with turpentine. Drive Away Ants.—A little quick-Lime placed in the infested places. Kill Insect Life.—Burn sulphur in a tightly closed room. It will kill al-most all insect life and their eggs and Bread—Medium 12 to 15 minutes; long or short fillet, larvae

Make Leather Waterproof.-Satur-ate it with castor oil; to stop shoes squaking, drive a peg into the middle of the sole

zine and runsed in a fresh supply. Hang in the air to dry. Clean Hair brushes.—Dissolve a lit

tle soda in warm water and pour in a small amount of amonia. Hold the small amount of amonia. Hold the brushes with the bristles downward and avoid wetting the back as far as possible; shake until the grease is removed; then rinse in cold water and put in the air to dry. Remove Stains from Linen.— Wet the part stained and has on it some

the part stained and lay on it some salt of wormwood; then rub without diluting it with more water.

How to Remove a Rusty Screw.-Apply a red hot iron to the head for a short time, the screw-driver being applied immediately while the screw is hot.

Remove Mildew from Cloth .--- Put a teaspoonful of chloride of lime into a quart of water, strain it twice, then dip the mildewed places in this weak solution and lay in the sun. If not ef-fective the first time repeat.

Cure Mosquito Bites.—Put ten drops of refined carbolic acid into an ounce of rose water; shake well and apply (If you hold your breath while a mos-quito has its bill in you it cannot withdraw it until you breathe again).

Cookies—10 to 15 minutes. Custards—15 to 20 minutes. Duck (tame)—40 to 60 minutes. Fish—6 to 8 lbs., 1 hour. Gingerbread—20 to 30 minutes. Craham Come 20 minutes. Gingerbread—20 to 30 minutes. Graham Gems—30 minutes. Lamb—Well doe, per lb., 15 min. Mutton—Rare, per lb., 10 minutes; well done, per lb., 15 minutes. Pie crust—30 to 40 minutes. Pork—Well done, per lb., 30 min. 

Save the old broom handles. You will find them convenient when wash ing the scrim curtains. To dry these pin one end to the wash line and through the hem of the opposite end run the broom handle which has previously been scoured. The curtains will dry perfectly straight and only the hems will need presing.
