## AROUND THE CITY

The re-establishment of a canning factory in Fredericton revives an industry which at one time attained considerable proportions in this city. It is to be hoped that the efforts of those behind the project will meet with success as this section of the province is admirably suited to the raising of the raw material of all kinds and the improved railway facilities give such a factory in this city a marked advantage. The D. W. Hoegg canning factory was the last which was operated here. After running for a number of years the owner who came from North ern Maine was attracted to Sussex where agricultural development was more pronounced than it was in this section and fruits and vegetables more readily procured. The Hoegg factory when first established here was in the old Collegiate School building, George Street, long since removed. Later the buildings now occupied as Macpherson's Garage, King Street, were erected for the factory.

the city recently. In response to an advertisement for a maid a young woman from Devon appeared and was hired. Next morning a man approached the man-of-the-house and informed him that his wife had deserted him and left three small children behind her, and was none other than the new "maid". That caused a complication but the situation was not at all clarified when a few hours later the husband appeared at the house and deposited the youngest child in the kitchen for the "maid" to care for. There was a vacancy immediately afterward.

The fact that three trials for murder engaged the attention of the Attorney General in New Brunswick this autumn recalls the fact that it has been several decades since there has been a trial for murder originating in Fredericton. The last was in connection with the death of a non-commissioned officer of the 22nd Foot now the Cheshire Regt., while the Imperial troops were stationed in this city. Since that time however York County outside this city has produced several murder cases. Tradition has it that a double execution took place following a murder, the gallows being erected in Carleton Street near Brunswick. Prior to the removal of the high picket fence which surrounded the Old Protestant Cemetery until some twenty years ago, an extraordinarily high mound could be observed near the George street entrance and small boys

of the neighborhood handed down to one another the story that that mound marked the last resting place of the two men executed. Old citizens say that the story of the boys was based on fact and that the bodies actually were interred in the outskirts of the cemetery near the George street gate.

The death of John H. Murch this week removes one who was the founder of what for a time was a flourishing industry in St. Mary's Ferry now part of the Town of Devon. The industry was the manufacture of laundry soap and the factory was located in water street near the Reverside Hotel. The name given the product was "Celestial" soap. After the manufacture of soap was abandoned the building had various vicissitudes, immediately after the big St. Mary's fire in the 90's it was occupied temporarily as a dry goods store and later as a taxidermy and tannery for hides of deer, moose and caribou. While being used as the latter it caught fire and burned.

The registration among the women eligible to vote under provincial legislation was delayed for various reasons. Some "mere men" are unkind enough to say that a decided objection to writing the word "spinster" under the head of classification kept many ladies away from the revisors' office and others—the younger ones—objected to the general public knowing whether or not they were twenty-one or more.

The keeping of boarders during the academic years of the Provincial Normal School and the University of New Brunswick at one time was quite a business in Fredericton but in late years a change has been observed and now there are not enough boarding-houses to go around. Time was when there was keen competition between
