After the manufacture of soap was abandoned the building had various vicisitudes, immediately after the big St. Mary's fire in the 90's it was occupied temporarily as a dry goods store and later as a taxidermy and tannery for hides of deer, moose and caribou. While being used as the latter it caught fire
