

SEASON CLOSED WITH BOOM FOR HORSE FLESH

DEMAND FOR GOOD HORSES EXCEEDS VISIBLE SUPPLY

Some Fall Fairs in the States Suffered From Fields Failing to Fill—A Good Season.

The waning year as it passes in retrospection brings a feeling that is a combination of pleasure and comfortableness to those who are identified with the harness horse interests either as a pastime or a business.

Surely 1919 leaves pleasant memories, which are intensified by the promise that 1920 will be even a greater year for the trotter and pacer.

Taken all in all this past year has been one of the most successful that harness horse racing has ever known. More people than ever before turned out to see the racing and the season closed with more orders placed for next year's campaign than the commissioners can fill.

There seemed to be an abundance of horses at the early meetings but as the season reached Fall fair time the fields shrank and many track managers had hard work to secure enough horses to furnish entertainment for their crowds.

The Eastern end of the Grand Circuit fared better than for a long time in the matter of horses, had an increased attendance but was hurt by rain.

Here in New England the sport flourished from early June until November with better racing and larger crowds than have been seen in more than a dozen years.

Before the sulkies were at away the demand for future racing material became so strong that some feared an unnatural boom but the Fall sale season demonstrated that the boom had a solid foundation. Never have yearlings sold as well as this Fall, while the supply of ready-to-race horses is considerably short of the demand.

There was hardly more than a suggestion of a revival of breeding last Spring, but the signs all point to a decided increase in that line the coming season.


Dramatic Ocean Greeting
