MR. ROCKEFELLER TOLD OF PROGRESS OF PHILANTHROPY

The Early Days of the Man Who Lately Gave to the World a Christmas Gift of \$100,000,000—Recalls When He Gave One Cent to Sabbath School, Ten Cents to Foreign Missions and Fifty Cents to a Mite Society.

The man who gave to the world yesterday a Christmas present of \$100,000,000 created a new high standard for those persons of large fortune who, for the public weal, seek intelligently to divest themselves of much of their accumulated millions before death. He is the man who in 1856 when a youth struggling with poverty was proud of the fact that within the period of one year he gave twenty cents to the cause of foreign missions fifty to the Mite Society and twelve cents to the Five Points Mission in New York.

And Mr. Rockefeller was and is no less proud of the fact that in those days of a meagre income and a tight purse he scrupulously kept in his little ledger an account of his revenues and all his expenditures including his small benefices.

Mr. Rockefeller today probably could not tell, even if he would the amount of his fortune within many millions. It is doubtful if he could approximate within less than \$1,000,000 or \$2,000,000 the actual aggregate sum of all his public gifts, though the best attainable estimate places the amount at from \$412,000,000 to \$415,000,000. But in those days of his early struggle he made it a point to know his assets and his liabilities to a dollar.

Away back in 1897, more than twenty-two years ago, John D. Rockefeller St., made a notable talk to the Young Men's Bible Class of the Fifth Avenue Baptist Church, of which the Rev. W. H. P. Faunce was then the pastor. Much that he then said assumes a peculiarly dramatic interest today affording a striking contrast between his latter day munificence and his small beginnings in philanthropy, as described in his own language. His plain, homely talk to this class of young men throws a flood of light, moreover upon the habits and the maxims of this extraordinary man who can crown a long series of princely gifts with a single donation large enough for a nation's ransom.

Addressing the young men of the Bible Class on the evening of March 27, 1897 Mr. Rockefeller said:

"Although I cannot make you a speech, I have brought with me to show you young men a little book—a book, I think which may interest you. It is the first ledger I kept. I was trained in business affairs, and I was taught how to keep a ledger. The practice of keeping a little personal ledger by young men just starting in business and earning money and requiring to learn its value is, I think, a good one. In the first struggle to get a footing—and if you feel as I did I am sorry for you, although I would not be without the memory of that struggle—I kept my accounts in this book and also some memoranda of little incidents that seemed to me important. In after years I found that book and brought it to New York. It is more than forty-two years since I wrote what it contains. I call it Ledger A, and now I place the greatest value upon it.

Mr. Rockefeller then produced from his pocket carefully wrapped in paper the ledger to which he referred. Proceeding, he said:

"When I read it through it brought to my mind remembrances of the care with which I used to record my little

items of receipts and disbursements—matters, I think, which many of you young men are rather careless about. I believe it is a religious duty to get all the money you can, fairly and honestly; to keep all you can and to give away all you can. I think that is a problem that you are all familiar with.

I have told you before what pleasure this little book gives me. I dare not let you read it through because my children who have read it, say that I did not spell toothbrush correctly. But then, you know we have made great progress in our spelling, and I suppose some changes have taken place since those days. I have not seen this book for twenty-five years. It does not look like a modern ledger, does it? But you could not get that book from me for all the modern ledgers in New York nor for all that they would bring.

"It almost brings tears to my eyes when I read over this little book and it fills me with a sense of gratitude that I cannot express. It shows largely what I received and what I paid out during my first years of business. It shows that from September 26, 1855 until January 1, 1856, I received \$50. Out of that I paid my washerwoman and the lady I boarded with, and I saved a little money to put away. I am not ashamed to read it over to you.

"Among other things I find that I gave a cent to the Sunday school every Sunday. That is not a very large sum, is it? But that was all the money I had to give for that particular object. I was also giving to several other religious objects and what I could afford to give regularly, as I was taught to do, and it has been a pleasure to me all my life to do so.

"I had a large increase in my revenue the next year. It went up to \$25 a month. I began to be a capitalist and had I regarded myself then the same way as we regard capitalists now I ought to have felt like a criminal because I had so much money

"I paid my own bills and always had a little something to give away, and the happiness of saving some. In fact I am not so independent now as I was then. It is true I could not secure the most fashionable cut of clothing. I remember I bought mine then of a cheap clothier. He sold me clothing cheap, clothing such as I could pay for and it was a great deal better than buying clothing that I could not pay for. I did not make any obligations I could not meet. I lived within my means, and my advice to you young

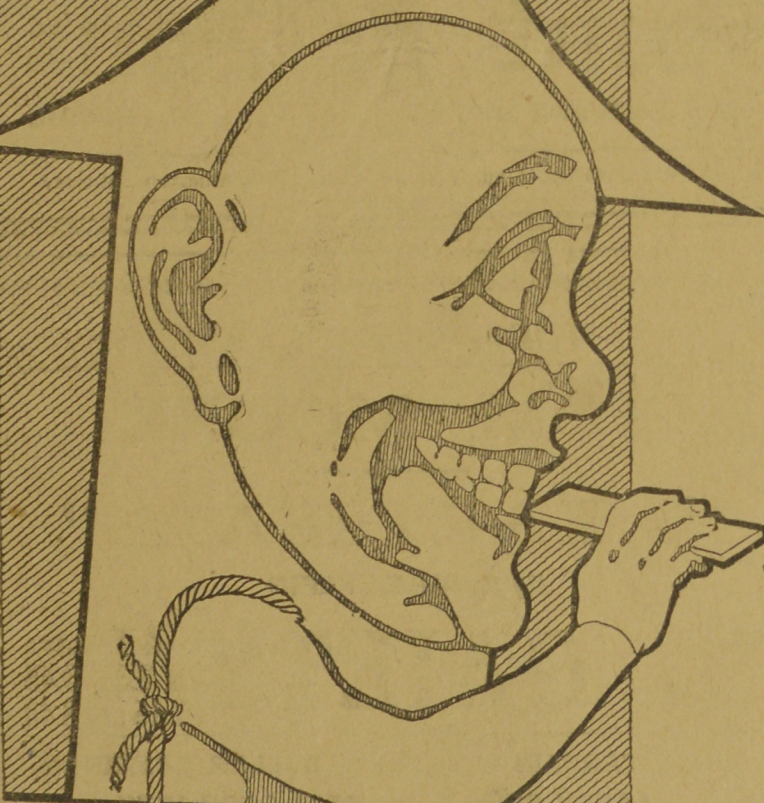
