

DRY WOOLENS IN HOUSE.

Woolens should be dried in the house on very cold days. The secret of drying woolen so that it does not shrink lies in drying it quickly. It should be hung on a warm, dry room, but not dried so rapidly that you can see steam rising from it, as this very rapid drying shrinks it.

It is a good idea to iron all woolens before they are quite dry. Shrinking is caused by the intertwining of the wool fibres which are jagged so that they catch on each other, and the ironing while the wool is still damp helps to keep the fibres from matting together. There are boards that come to stretch stockings and various undergarments on while they are drying and these are well worth buying for expensive woolens.

## SUGGESTIONS.

Wash the piano keys with a damp rather than a wet cloth.

If the clothesline is boiled before used, it will not stretch.

Green peppers and olives will lend color to macaroni salad.

Never clean aluminum with strong soap or scouring powder.

Oysters chopped and served in the gravy of a juicy steak are delicious.

When making olive sandwiches put the olives through the meat grinder.

Always have the water boiling rapidly before putting macaroni on to boil.

Always be sure, when you buy meat, to have the butcher send home the trimmings.

Deep bands of lace finish the buttons of evening capes.

Both dinner and evening gowns have sleeves which are hardly more than caps.

## OILCLOTH DOILIES.

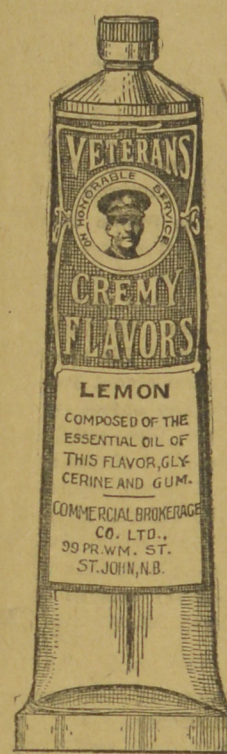
