NEW BUILDING ATTRACTS MUCH ATTENTION

One of the main features on the fair grounds is the new Transportation Building, which is built of concrete blocks manufactured by the Concrete Builders, Ltd., of Fredericton. The building is 125 feet long by 80 feet wide, and 22 feet high. It has 126 large windows and faces the Smythe street entrance. It is used on the ground floor for autos, engines and things of that sort, while on the upper floor is the splendid display of poultry. On the same floor is located the New Brunswick Forestry Exhibit, which is very attractive and beautifully laid out.

Ald. Judson Barker, who was the builder in charge of the work, deserves great credit for having finished the structure in just two months. Considering the wet weather and the lack of labor, it is wonderful that the job is so complete. Mr. Barker had several other jobs under way at the same time, both inside the main building and around the grounds.

The Transportation Building is a most imposing structure and is much admired by all visitors to the Fair. It is a credit to the Agricultural Society as well as to the energetic builder.

Peter Farren Distanced In the Free-For-All

St. John Horse Backed Heavily to Win, Made Miserable Showing—Fern Hal Won With John A. Hal and White Sox Taking One Heat Each—Frank Boutilier Took 2.25 Trot in Straight Heats with Bavius—Attendance Large.

Fern Hal won the Free-for-All and Bavius the 2.25 Trot on the second day of the Fredericton Exhibition harness meet. The best time of the day was 2.12 1/4, by John A. Hal in the Free-for-All, and as the track was not in the best of condition after Tuesday night's rain it was fast. The attendance was better than at the first day's races, although the weather was threatening and raw. With the better weather today there should be another big crowd.

Peter Farren Away Off.

The outstanding feature of the day was the very poor showing of Peter Farren, which was favored strongly by a big St. John contingent and also by some Fredericton people. This horse acted badly in the scoring for the first heat of the Free-for-All and gave Starter Frank Power so much trouble that he warned Driver Johnson that he would have to bring his horse along, as the start would be no longer delayed.

The Farren horse got away to a poor start and never regained the lost ground, getting the flag at the finish. The decision to send the field away with Peter Farren looking after himself was applauded, but the performance of the horse was a bitter pill for his backers.

Matched Race not Arranged

Soon afterward it was announced from the judges' stand that Mr. P. O'Keefe of St. John owner of Peter Farren was ready to race his horse against any of the other three entries in a fortnight's time for \$500 or \$1000 a side. W. G. Fenwick of Bathurst later posted \$100 for a race over the Woodstock track, between his horse John A. Hal and Peter Farren. The two owners got together but failed to agree Mr. Fenwick wanting two heats out of three and the owner of Peter Farren three out of five.

Easy for Bavius

Frank Boutilier up behind Bavius had the easiest kind of a victory in the 2.25 Trot. He took it in straight heats while the fight was for the other positions. Addie B. finished well up but twice was set back, once for breaking and being bad gaited and the other for being bad gaited. Forefeather after being second in the first heat was distanced in the third heat. He and Peter Farren both were from the

O'Keefe stable which seemed to have struck a bad day. Sam McKinney took second money and Harvest Hope a Fredericton horse third.

The Free-for-All

The Free-for-All went five heats being much cut up by John A. Hal and White Sox each winning heats. When the final heat was won by Fern Hal the race barely escaped going over till today as the sun was about down. The taking of heats by these two horses livened matters in the betting and those who backed the field against the winner at the right time were fortunate. The first heat was between Fern Hal and John A. Hal with the latter winning with the other forcing him right to the wire. The second heat was between the same two horses with a great finish. Fern Hal took the heat. In the next White Sox showed speed getting second place to Fern Hal's first. White Sox went one better in the next heat winning in a finish which brought the crowd to its feet. There was a long wait for the next heat partly on account of tardiness of John A. Hal. White Sox was backed by many to win but in a whipping finish Fern Hal nosed out the other Sussex horse.

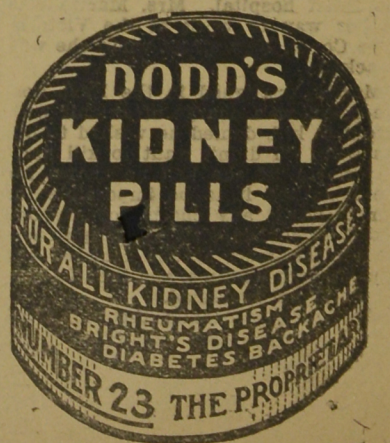
