SALE OF TIMBER LICENSES LARGELY ATTENDED BUT BIDDING NOT BRISK; TRAINING GROUND WITHDRAWN

Some Eighty Miles Bid in Yesterday Afternoon — Fraser Companies, Limited, and Charles C. Baird, of Chipman, Heavy Buyers — River Valley Lumber Company and Bonny River Lumber Company Also Bought Berths.

The sale of timber licenses on a River, four square miles; 31. St stumpage basis took place yesterday afternoon in the large committee room of the parliament buildings, with a large attendance of lumbermen. In all about 257 square miles of timber lands were put up for sale of which about 88 square miles were bid in. Some seventy five and one half square miles of Training Ground Reserves were withdrawn from the sale before it started. Although there were many persons present the bidding was slow at times and the majority of those berths that were sold brought only the upset price. Out of the 88 square miles of licenses sold 62 brought the upset price. The only large bid that was made was \$25 by A. Alcorn for a berth on Cain's River above the mouth of Muzroll's brook the upset price of which was \$5.50. In one instance only was the upset price lowered and then it was reduced to \$5 from \$6.50 without a bid being made for it. Fraser Companies Limited and Charles G. Baird of Chipman were the largest bidders, the former securing five berths with a total area of 11 square miles while the latter secured five berths with an extent of 14 miles. The Bonny River Lumber Company and the River Valley Lumber Company also secured a number of berths. Mr. E. H. Allen of this city acted as auctioneer at the sale.

Conditions of Sale

The conditions of the sale were as follows: The lease is to run for two years until August 21st, 1921. There is to be no ground rent or fire protection tax. The ten per cent deposit will be credited on the stumpage account of lumber cut this year. If the lumber is not all removed from the berth this winter the licensee will be required to put up a further deposit of ten per cent on the remainder of the standing lumber before commencing another year's operations.

Lumber cut on the St. Croix River lots from No. 23 Mud Lake to No. 35 and including No. 58 may be shipped out of the Province in the round log. The sale is upon the condition that the standing lumber is cut this year in accordance with the timber regulations, but any of such lumber remaining uncut a further year may be removed.

May Cut at Once

At the close of the sale Col. T. G. Loggie Deputy Minister announced that those who had purchased licenses could start cutting the lumber immediately if they wished to do so.

19. Two Mile Brook, two square miles, bid in by A. R. Loggie at upset price of \$5.50.

20. Eel River, Kent County, two square miles, upset price \$6 bid in by A. R. Loggie for \$7.

21. Parish of Musquash, St. John County, 2 square miles, upset price \$5.50 no bids.

22. Bonny River, Charlotte County, 6½ square miles upset \$6.00 no bids.

23. Mud Lake, Parish of Dumbarton, 2 square miles; 24. East of Tryon Settlement, Digdegash River, 2 square miles; 25. Chiputneticook Lakes, 6 square miles; 26. Palfrey Brook, York County, two square miles; 28. Digdegash River and head of Clarence Brook, 2½ square miles; 29. Canous River, 8½ square miles; 30. Canous

31. St. Croix River and Schoodic Lakes, two square miles; 32. Canous River, Eastern side of St. Croix, six square miles; 33. St. James, Charlotte County 3½ square miles; 34. 1st Chiputneticook Lakes, two square miles; 35. Pirate Brook and eastern side of Schoodic Lakes, seven square miles; all brought no bids, \$6.50 being the upset price of each.

27. Eastern side St. Croix River, 4 square miles was bid in at upset price of \$5 by H. F. Dickinson.

36. West of Magaguadavic River, 6 square miles, bid in at upset price of \$6 by Bonny River Lumber Co.

37. Western side of Magaguadavic at Cox Brook, to Bonny River Lumber Co. at upset price of \$6.

38. Eastern side Magaguadavic River, 3 square miles to Charles Anderson upset price of \$6.

Lots number 39, 40, 41, 42, and 43 including some 11 square miles were bid in by the Fraser Companies Ltd., 39 at \$6 the upset price being \$5.50, 40 at \$5.75 the upset price being \$5.50 and 41, 42 and 43 at the upset price of \$5.50. These lots lie about Little Magaguadavic Lake.

Lots number 44, 45, and 46 with upset price at \$5.50 brought no bids.

44. North west of Calamingo Brook, Kings County, consists of some five square miles of timber land.

45. South Branch of the Salmon River, Kings County consists of 2 square miles of timber land.

46. Head of Cumberland Creek consists of six square miles of timber.

47. Cumberland Creek, 4 square miles, was bid in at the upset price, \$5.50 by W. J. Colwell of Cumberland Creek.

48. Gaspereau River, Queens County 3 square miles was bid in by Charles G. Baird of Chipman at the upset price \$5.50.

49. Meadow Brook, Branch of Gaspereau River, two square miles was bid in at \$8.00 by F. S. McCormack of Blackville, the upset price being \$5.50.

50. Gaspereau River, below mouth of Meadow Brook, two square miles, was bid in at the upset price of \$5.50 by Charles G. Baird of Chipman.

51. Gaspereau River, three square miles was bid in at \$5.50, upset price by Charles G. Baird of Chipman.

52. Gaspereau River, three square miles was bid in by Charles G. Baird of Chipman at the upset price \$5.50.

53. Fork Brook, branch Little River, 3 square miles, at upset price to Bonny River Lumber Co., at \$6.

54. Rockwell Stream, Branch of Ormococt River, two square miles, upset price \$6 No bid.

55. Shirley Settlement, Sunbury County, two square miles, upset price \$6 to Bonny River Lumber Company.

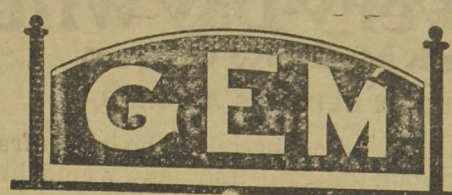
