



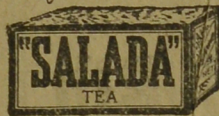

GERMANS IN ENGLAND WISH TO REMAIN

London, Nov. 25.—There are many Germans in England who are not keen on going back to the Fatherland. They have had letters from Germany as to conditions and despite strikes and other troubles they still prefer to live in "perfidious Albion."

Almost 4,300 civilian aliens of enemy nationality of 24,450 interned in the country at the date of the armistice appealed to be exempted from the order for immediate repatriation upon their ultimate release. They have had their cases examined by Justice Younger's committee, which has completed its work. Of the cases considered 3,250 were those of Germans, 1,000 Austrians or Hungarians and fewer than fifty Turks.

The committee recommended for exemption approximately 3,030. Germans, 840 Austrians and 20 Turks. The final result, therefore, is that of the alien enemies interned at the date of the armistice about 84 per cent. have been repatriated and 16 per cent only have been commended for exemption.

RETURN TO STRAIGHT RUGBY RULES NEEDED

SOME AUTHORITIES
SHOULD TAKE ACTION

Game in Maritime Provinces
Would be Greatly Benefited
—Rule Books and Qualified Referees.

With the trustees of the Clark Trophy emblematic of the championship of the Western Inter-collegiate Rugby League of the Maritime Provinces, called upon to decide concerning the disposition of the trophy this year because of departure from the spirit of the rules of the game on the part of Acadia, and with Halifax newspapers "panning" the teams of that city for the football "hash" which they have put up in place of Rugby, it is almost time that some authorities were taking action to straighten out the football tangle in the Maritime Provinces.

The trouble is due largely to ignorance of the rules of the game and to lax refereeing. If there could be hundreds of rule books published and distributed among players and especially among boys who will be the players in a few years' time, much of the trouble would be stopped automatically and if referees were required to have some qualifications as to acquaintance with the rules, that would help greatly.

Halifax is supposed to have the best brand of Rugby in the Maritime Provinces and yet writers on papers in that city constantly confuse goal-line and touch-line, try and touch-down. The latter probably is due to the influence of Canadian or American football, but the side-lines of a field are the touch-lines in both the other games and in neither is the goal-line called the touch-line.

In the intercollegiate league the rule permitting so-called "safeties"—really touch-downs—to count in the case of a draw or tie, is obsolete and should be abandoned. There has been no instance in the league in years where it has been required to decide a score. In fact it would be better for all leagues to get right down to Rugby rules and abide by them.

It might help to quite an extent if the proper designations of the players were used instead of borrowing terms from American or Canadian football. Halves might be termed three-quarters as they are in the Old Country and quarters be termed halves. Then the term five-eighths could be used to designate the "flying quarter" with some indication of his position.

BRITISH PASTOR A BANKRUPT

London, Nov. 25.—The Rev. Joseph Baldwin Meredith of Nubbarholm has been forced into bankruptcy. He said he had been in Burma nearly nine years as a chaplain at \$65 monthly. On returning to England fourteen years ago his assets were \$250. He had various curacies at stipends of \$500 to \$800 per year, eventually becoming vicar of Nubbarholm at \$1,000.

His wife had been out sick nursing and was now a waitress in London. To keep the pot boiling he had sold his furniture and the vicarage was practically bare of furniture. The estimated deficiency was \$4,800.
