

FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS WILL BE EXPENDED

CONTRACT FOR DAM IS AWARDED MONTREAL FIRM

Ambursen Hydraulic Construction Company will Begin Work at Marysville Shortly.

The Ambursen Hydraulic Construction Company of Montreal will begin at once the construction of a concrete dam across the Nashwaak River at Marysville for the Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Company. Mr. N. M. Jones of St. John managing director of the Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Company who arrived today from St. John announced that the contract for the dam had been awarded to that firm. He said that he did not care to state what the price would be but said that his company would be spending fifty thousand dollars in Marysville this summer.

Fifteen Foot Head of Water

Mr. Jones said that the dam would be situated a short distance above the site of the old wooden structure which furnished power for the Alexander Gibson sawmill and which was carried away by ice some years ago. The dam will be of concrete and will be twelve feet high. A fifteen foot head of water will be given by it.

Nothing Yet About Pulp Mill

Mr. Jones when asked concerning the reported intention of his company to erect a pulp mill at Marysville which will manufacture the lumber cut on the Nashwaak and heretofore manufactured into pulp at St. John said that he had nothing which he could say at the present time, also that there were several matters which must be cleared up before he would be in a position to make an announcement. It is generally believed that the construction of a dam is the forerunner of a pulp mill at Marysville.

ACTIVITY IN MOTOR BUSINESS IS REPORTED

FORD GARAGE WILL BE ERECTED AT ONCE

Movement Afoot for a Large Garage Near Court House Sq. — Adams Property Mentioned.

There is evidence of renewed activity in motor-business in and about Fredericton. Fredericton Motors Limited has erected a new garage at the corner of Campbell street and Court House Square. Mr. R. L. Phillips, Ford District Agent, has begun the erection of a new garage in Campbell street at Phoenix Square on the site of the old Sypher property and a movement is afoot to organize a company for the building of yet another garage to be located in the eastern portion of the city. The Adams property which was demolished after being damaged in a recent fire is spoken of as a possible site for the proposed garage.

New Ford Garage

Mr. R. L. Phillips stated today that preparations were already being begun for the building of the new Ford garage on Campbell Street. The site of the building is the Sypher property near Phoenix Square and the buildings there are being rapidly torn down. The contract has been awarded to Mr. John C. Smith of this city. The building will be about sixty feet by seventy five feet, one story high and will have a concrete basement with a brick super-structure.

Proposed Undertaking

For some time past local men have been attempting to organize a company to establish a garage in the vicinity of Court House Square. The promoters are not yet in a position to make any announcement. It is understood that owners of cars in the city were to be interested in the project with the intention of making it co-operative to a certain extent. It is reported that there have been negotiations for the property in Court House Square owned by Miss Elizabeth Adams. If the original idea is followed this garage would be on a larger scale than any other in the city.
