


HOW TO BREW TEA.

From an old tea merchant in Lon don comes instructions for making a perfect cup of tea. First rinse out the teapot with cold water and then fill it with boiling water and let stand while you bring the water intended for the tea to a boil. Just before the water boils, turn out the water from the teapot and wipe dry. Then add the tea; leaves and pour on the freshly boiling water. Cover the pot with a tea cosy or wrap in a towel and let stand exactly for seven minutes. This will give you a delicious drink of ambrosia that will delight the heart of true lov-

ers of a good cup of tea. The use of a cosy for the teapot is to hold the heat in the pot and thus prevent quick cooling. Use one level teaspoon of tea to each one-half pint cup of water. Measure the water before boiling. The water must be pour ed on the tea immediately upon reaching the boiling point. After boiling for two minutes or longer the water quickly loses its natural gases.

Place in a bowl one-half cup of grat d store cheese and then add one tablespoon of grated onion, two table spoons of finely minced green pepper one teaspoon of salt, one teaspoon of paprika, one-half teaspoon of mustard, six tablespoons of mayonnaise dress ing. Mix thoroughly and then spread between the bread as prepared for

bread-and-butter sandwiches.

Country Cheese Sandwiches. Place one cup of country or butter. milk cheese in a bowl and add onehalf cup of thick mayonnaise dressing, one onion, chopped very fine, one green pepper, chopped very fine, two teaspoons of paprika, one half teaspoon of mustard

Deviled Egg Sandwiches.

Chop three hard-boiled eggs fine and then place in a bowl and add one tablespoonful of grated onion, three tablespoons of finely minced parsley, three tablespoons of finely minced green pepper, six tablespoons of mayonnaise dressing, two teaspoons of salt, one easpoon of paprika, one teaspoon of Worcestershire sauce, one-half teaspoon of mustard.

BRIEF BUT USEFUL RECIPES.

Restore Gin Frames.-Rub with a sponge moistened with turpentine. Drive Away Ants.—A little quick lime placed in the infested places. Remove Tar from Cloth—Rub it

well with turpentine till every trace s removed. Make Leather Waterproof .- Satur-

ate it with castor oil; to stop shoes squaking, drive a peg into the middle of the sole. Clean the Hair .- Wash well with a

mixture of soft water, 1 pint; sal soda 1 ounce; cream tartar ¼ ounce. Egg Stains on Spoons.—Rub with common salt.

Clean Gloves .- Pour a little benzine into a basin and wash the gloves in it, rubbing and squeezing them until clean. If much solled, they must be washed again through clean ben-zine and rinsed in a fresh supply Hang in the air to dry.

Clean Hair brushes.—Dissolve a lit-tle soda in warm water and pour in a small amount of amonia. Hold the brushes with the bristles downward and avoid wetting the back as far as possible; shake until the grease is removed; then rinse in cold water and put in the air to dry. Remove Mildew from Cloth.---Put a

quart of water, strain it twice, then dip the mildewed places in this weak solution and lay in the sun. If not ef-fective the first time repeat.





Beat to mix, pour in well greased and floured loaf-shape pan and bake thirty minutes in moderate oven.




