

They Are Based Largely on Famous Eighteenth Century Designs-Materials are Sumptuous.



They are based largely on 18th century designs and the sumptuous materials used in those days are again in favor. But there is one great difference between the fashions of the Court at Versailles and those of modern France. The stiffness has gone out of them. They break the monotony of squares and stripes and give the impression of width without additional volume of material. Then there is the sack-coat, with various forms of adjustments in front. 
#### The Round Shoulder Cape.
