

TRIMMINGS TO GO BIG.

Metallic Effects Especially Wanted

Cellophane is probably the biggest new feature one firm is showing and one of the many things they are selling in great abundance. The metallic cloths and the gold and silver brocaded effects that bid fair to seeing a record season in the millinery world are in a great way responsible for the demand for the metallic and spangle trimmings which this concern is featuring extensively. In this connection they are showing large maline piques more or less covered with jet and iridescent spangles which have used for the underbrims of metallic cloth hats. The combination is very effective.

## SUMMER BED FOR BABY.

Knock the sides off an orange crate, leaving the frame intact, use the top of the crate for the bottom of the bed; cover the sides with wire screening and place the bed on a set of discarded wagon wheels or use like a basket. Finish with white enamel paint and provide a piece of mosquito netting to throw over the top. You will find this a sanitary and attractive bed for the little one.

## RANDOM REMINDERS.

To make shoes wear longer, varnish the soles with copal varnish and let dry.

When the ends of shoestrings come off take some library paste and put on the ends of the strings and let dry.

When hubby's shorts are worn too much for him to wear any longer, take the backs of them and make neat aprons and use the other parts for dusters.

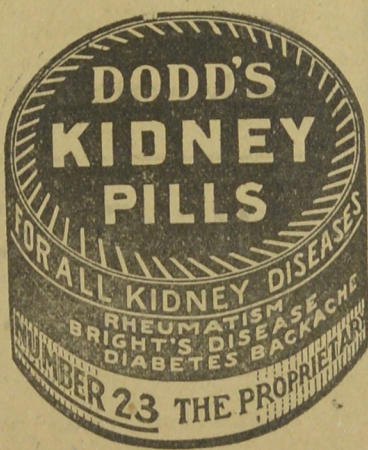
Fruit stains on linen should be removed with glycerine and left for perhaps an hour; then wash the stains in warm, soapy water. Repeat the process if necessary.

Scratches on dark oak furniture may be greatly improved in appearance by carefully painting the scars with iodine, using as many coats as necessary to produce the right color. When dry go over the whole piece of furniture with a good furniture polish.

To prevent a cake from burning, place the cane pan in a larger pan with salt enough to cover the bottom of the pan; let pan of salt heat with the oven. This is sure and tested. Salt may be used over and over. It is best to keep a pan of salt always on hand. Never falls even in oil stove.

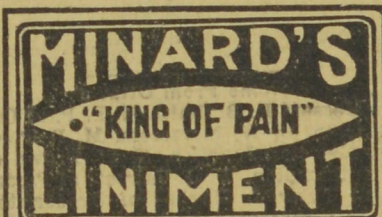
