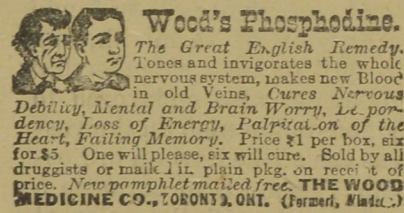

RATEPAYERS WHO ARE
ASSESSED LARGEST AMOUNTS

City Tax Notices Now Being Distributed — F. B. Edgecombe

Pays Largest Total Tax, Personal and Business — Hugh
Calder the largest Personal Ratepayer—Maritime Electric
Company Pays Largest Single Tax.

Tax notices are being distributed in Fredericton this week, and the
server, City Marshal James Roberts, is being greeted more or less heartily.
The fact that the rate is lower than in 1918 has made some of the bills slightly
less than they were, but the fact that there has been an increase in personal
property and incomes has made others increase. The list which follows con-
tains the names of all ratepayers who are assessed for more than \$75.

The largest single assessment apart from the yanks is that of the Mari-
time Electric Company, which amounts to \$2,200. Fred B. Edgecombe per-
sonally is assessed \$1,257, and the F. B. Edgecombe Co. is assessed \$1,640,
making a total of \$2,897, the largest in the list. The next largest is the Bank
of Montreal, with \$2,823.64 for both branches. The Royal Bank comes next
with \$2,747.90. A. F. Randolph & Sons pay the highest tax of any business
house, \$1,750, and R. Chestnut & Sons, with \$1,726, come a close second. J. S.
Neill & Sons, with \$1,410, are third. The New Brunswick Telephone Co. is
second to the Maritime Electric Company among the public utilities, paying
\$1,540. Ex-Ald. Hugh Calder, now of Los Angeles, Cal., is taxed \$1,343, the
largest amount for any individual ratepayer. The Edward Moore estate, with
\$1,510, is first among the estates, and the James Hodge estate, with \$1,171, is
second. The third place is taken by the Frank I. Morrison estate with \$1,102.
Among the individual ratepayers some of the large amounts assessed are:
H. G. Kitchen, \$1,024; A. B. Kitchen, \$941; J. F. VanBuskirk, \$848; W. W.
