

AROUND THE CITY

Any present at either the matinee or evening performance of the Boston English Opera Company on Wednesday in City Opera House must have been impressed with the fact that a modern theatre with seating capacity sufficient for the theatre-going public of Fredericton and vicinity is a necessity and also could be made a paying investment. The contention that motion pictures have destroyed theatrical business in Fredericton is belied each and every time a travelling company performs at the Opera House. The latter has existed practically as it is today since the City Hall was erected over forty years ago. About 1895 it was improved—and that in the face of determined opposition within and without the City Council—but now it is hopelessly out of date. No production which carries scenery more modern than that of 1900 can even get it on the stage and the result is that fine performances have to be cut to pieces on that account, while towns much smaller than Fredericton with modern theatres can see them in their entirety. All scenery must be hoisted three stories through a small trap door to reach the stage while modern requirements are that a stage should be as near the ground level as possible. When established the City Opera House filled a great want as private enterprise then-fought shy of putting money into a theatre, but nowadays its existence is a bar to any such enterprise. The opinion which travelling companies entertain of the theatre is exemplified by the phrase painted near one of the dressing rooms—"This is one fine theatre"

The list of heavy tax-payers for 1919 in the City of Fredericton shows that but four chartered banks now are doing business in Fredericton although one of those has two branches. A few years ago this city boasted six banks, one of them a local undertaking. They were the People's Bank of New Brunswick, Royal Bank of Canada, Bank of Nova Scotia, Bank of New Brunswick, Bank of Montreal, Bank of British North America. Since that time the Bank of Montreal absorbed the People's Bank, the shareholders of which were Fredericton people and also the Bank of B. N. A. although it still maintains the latter as a separate branch, and the Bank of Nova Scotia has absorbed the Bank of New Brunswick. The Canadian Bank of Commerce however has entered the field here bringing the number up to four.

Banking in the rural districts of Central New Brunswick has developed remarkably within the past few years. Branch banks are now located at Minto, Chipman, Fredericton Junction, Harvey, Stanley and Devon. A comparatively short time ago Marysville was the only place outside of Fredericton which had a bank and that was because of the payrolls of the Gibson manufacturing enterprises in that town. Marysville has since lost its bank St. Mary's, now part of Devon, once had a bank, lost it, but regained it when the Bank of Commerce located a branch there recently

It is terrible how the cost of living advances. It is said that on the day of the Peace Celebration a hard-working liquor-retailer wanted eighteen dollars for a long-neck of his goods. History does not say whether or not he got his price. Six or eight dollars, however, are not unusual prices.

The remarkable results achieved in honey-production at the Department of Agriculture where two hives were placed in the garden June 4th, has attracted general attention. Many citizens are thinking of taking up bee-keeping. One man when told of the fact that one hundred pounds of honey had been taken from one hive at the Department said, "Gosh! I guess I'll keep a bee."

Great bodies move slowly. The Fredericton City Council is living right up to that. The bathing season is more than half over and the dressing rooms and the diving float which the city purchased last year at a cost of

several hundreds of dollars are still safely stored away. By the time the river-water is too cold for bathing it is possible that the Council will take proceedings toward putting the float in the water and the dressing-rooms on the shore at the West End Beach, although there are some who are willing to take a bet that the Council will not be aware by that time that there are such things as dressing-rooms and diving-float in existence.
