## BOYS' PIG CLUBS HAVE SPLENDID EXHIBIT IN THE SWINE CLASSES— CHESTERS, YORKSHIRES, BERKSHIRES

Object Lesson of What Can be Accomplished in New Brunswick by Effort and Attention—Pure Bred Swine Raised in the Province Now Available—Department of Agriculture Heartily Congratulated—Heavy Prize Winners at Woodstock and St. Stephen.

In the livestock section of the Fredericton Exhibition of 1919 which is considered excellent, particularly in the departments of sheep and swine an exhibit which is attracting much attention on the part of the general public is that of The Boys' Pig Clubs of the Province. This exhibit is plainly marked by a huge sign and consists of a large number of pens of swine, Yorkshires and Berkshires predominating. As the Livestock Branch of the New Brunswick Department of Agriculture, made special efforts to establish and foster these clubs among the boys of the farming communities it is taking considerable pride in the showing which the club-members are making at the fairs held in the province this autumn. At the Woodstock exhibition one of the club-members received twenty-four dollars in prize-money on one sow, meeting and defeating all comers with his exhibit. At the St. Stephen fair a similar incident occurred and it is expected that there will be a repetition at the Provincial Exhibition here as the Pig Club Exhibit surpasses those of the other two fairs.

#### Exhibits in All Classes

The boy-breeders have exhibits in all classes and it is expected that the more mature breeders will be hard pressed in the competition. The club-members have exhibits in all classes of the Yorkshire, Berkshire and Chester breeds. There are many mature sows of excellent quality and in first class condition and also young barrows which will be on the market this fall. Smooth young sows also are on exhibition. The ages of the members of The Boys' Pig Clubs range from fourteen to eighteen years and the farmers of the province will have an opportunity of taking an example from their fine exhibit.

#### Basis of the Clubs

The organization of these clubs was begun two years ago. For the past two springs the Department of Agriculture has been importing young pure-bred sows for these clubs composed of boys in the rural districts who are interested in the production of good stock. Prominent men in various parts of New Brunswick, themselves interested in stock-improvement, have given financial support to the Boys' Clubs. Among them are Hon. J. F. Tweeddale Minister of Agriculture, T. H. Estabrook of St. John who has a fine farm in Lincoln, Sunbury County, Joseph Allison of St. John, Harvey Mitchell of Keswick, R. A. Snowball of Chatham, Hon. J. E. Hetherington, M.P.P. of Cady's, Queens County, and J. H. King of Moncton.

## THE MASTER MIND TONIGHT AT OPERA HOUSE

The much talked of drama of politics and intrigue, "The Master Mind" which is to be presented at the Opera House by the Klark-Urban Company tonight is a play of the kind that has become popularized by the success of "Within the Law" and similar productions in which many of the scenes are laid in police stations, criminal courts and underworld environments. "The Master Mind" differs from most of its kind in that its setting is an elegantly furnished apartment, in New York, though occupied by a thief disguised as a gentleman, and the beautiful home of a former district attorney and aspirant for Governorship on the Hudson. It is a play of thrilling situations and strong emotions. The story, very briefly, is that the younger brother of a leader among the crooks of a great city, is condemned and executed for a homicide, for which he has pleaded the higher, or unwritten law as a justification. The older brother swears vengeance on the district attorney who prosecuted the case. In pursuit of his purpose he discovers a young girl of the streets, innocent and pure but well known to the police who has saved the district attorney's life by tearing up her skirt and bandaging up his arm after an auto accident, and whose kindness and beauty greatly interested him, but whom he was unable afterwards to find. The master crook who came to be known as "The Master Mind" in pursuit of his revenge managed to secure her release on a suspended sentence. He then sends her to Paris for four years to be educated. It is upon her return, a beautiful and accomplished young woman that the action of the play begins. The plot is to supply her with a bogus father and mother and brother all crooks with long police records, and to marry her to the district attorney, when they will compromise and disgrace her, although she is innocent, and by exposure, to blast the lawyer's ambition to be selected Governor. It all works out as planned. Revenge is accomplished, but it turns to ashes in his grasp for he finds that he has come to have a father's love for the girl he has used as his instrument of revenge. He cannot crush the man he has so hated without crushing her too, so he relinquishes his vengeance and all ends happily.

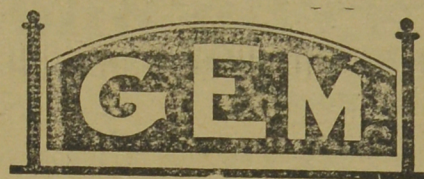
