THE PRINCE OF WALES WON  
ALL HEARTS IN OLD QUEBEC

Attended Divine Service in the Cathedral and Occupied the Royal Pew—Dean Shreeve Preached a Simple and Appropriate Sermon—The Prince Interviewed by Newspaper Correspondents and Camera Men.

Quebec, Aug. 25—An earthly Prince and a future King was seen yesterday morning in the most impressive setting, bowing his head in submission to the Divine King of the universe. It was when H.R.H. the Prince of Wales took his place in the Royal seat in the old Cathedral of Quebec.

Royalty in attendance upon a church service in Canada very often develops rather into a spectacle than worship, for the people throng to see. The present King recognized this when it is said that when last he was at church in the cathedral he refused to sit in the Royal seat, saying that he came to worship and not to be looked at. Paraphrasing Goldsmith, so far as the service yesterday was concerned, "Fools who came to gaze remained to pray," for the mein of the Prince was such that all entered into the spirit of worship.

The church was bright with flags eloquent flags, whilst the tattered colors of the 69th French-Canadian hung suspended from the pulpit. It was the most eloquent of all. Truly a Prince had come to pray.

The sermon of Dean Shreeve was simple and to the point. He attempted no flowery utterances, and for aught a stranger knew, it was an ordinary service in the old cathedral, and a Prince had slipped in to enjoy it. He did not dwell upon the fact that Royal visitor was present but rather did he refer to the future of the country and the problems of reconstruction facing the Empire. He pointed out the important part the church might play in the solution of

these problems.

The close of the service by the hymn, "Ocean to Ocean" was eminently fitting for such a service, attended by a sailor Prince. As the party filed out, there went down into the history of the cathedral the story of the visit of another worshipper of Royal blood to add to the list already shown on the church rolls.

## Chat With Correspondents

Saturday morning His Royal Highness met the newspaper correspondents and the photographers of the party. Up on the spacious roof garden of the quarters of the Duke of Devonshire at the Citadel, we were conducted.

As the Prince entered the room he was directed to the party and each member was introduced individually. It was the opportunity of the entire trip that we had so long looked forward to.

Below the citadel in the river swung the great Renown. Speaking of the view from the point he said: "It is quite a coincidence that when my father was here he, too, came on what was then the biggest fighting ship in the navy, the Indomitable and she too was anchored almost in the exact spot where the Renown is now. The Indomitable, then the greatest, could almost be swung on board the Renown. These are all what we call war babies."

One of the correspondents enquired of the Prince, if the Renown was the biggest ship afloat, and the Prince smilingly replied "Yes she is, and will be for about six weeks longer when the Hood will be commissioned." As the Prince spoke of these monster fighting ships of the British Navy, his face glowed with pride and his sailor qualities were outstanding and stamped upon his speech and expression.

## Brief Stay in U. S.

The American correspondents were very anxious to ask him about his visit to the United States. He said that his visit would necessarily be short there, and after asking how far Boston was from New York, he said he was afraid he would not be able to visit the former city. Referring to the newspaper correspondents and the photographers, he said that one became more or less accustomed to it, but your barrage is somewhat more intensified here than ours at home," he added with a smile. He said that he was looking forward with much expectancy to his visit to the United States.

He enquired of the C. P. R. photographer if he would be able to see the pictures taken at St. John, Halifax and here in Quebec, later in the trip. He was informed that arrangements had been made to show these pictures on the Royal train. "It will give one an opportunity to see how bad one

looks," he said with a smile.

His Royal Highness said that he saw a great difference between the Maritime Provinces and the Province of Quebec but did not say from what standpoint he saw the difference.

The wonderful view down the river and over the city from the Citadel was delightful, he said, while he remarked that the weather in Quebec had been splendid, although he was unfortunate so far as weather was concerned in St. John and Halifax.

The Prince chatted along pleasantly and there was not a man in the party who felt embarrassed in the presence of the Heir to the Throne, and the future King, so absolutely charming was his manner and the utter lack of pomp and display in the way in which he talked. He uses short, ordinary words and short sentences. He was accompanied by Lieutenant-Col. Henderson, Admiral Halsey and several of his Aides.

He then walked downstairs to the Ursuline Convent where he made a brief inspection. This was followed by a short inspection of the Hotel Dieu, and then the Prince began his private trip to Ste Anne De Beaupre. He was taken out in a special electric car, and luncheon was served on board the car.

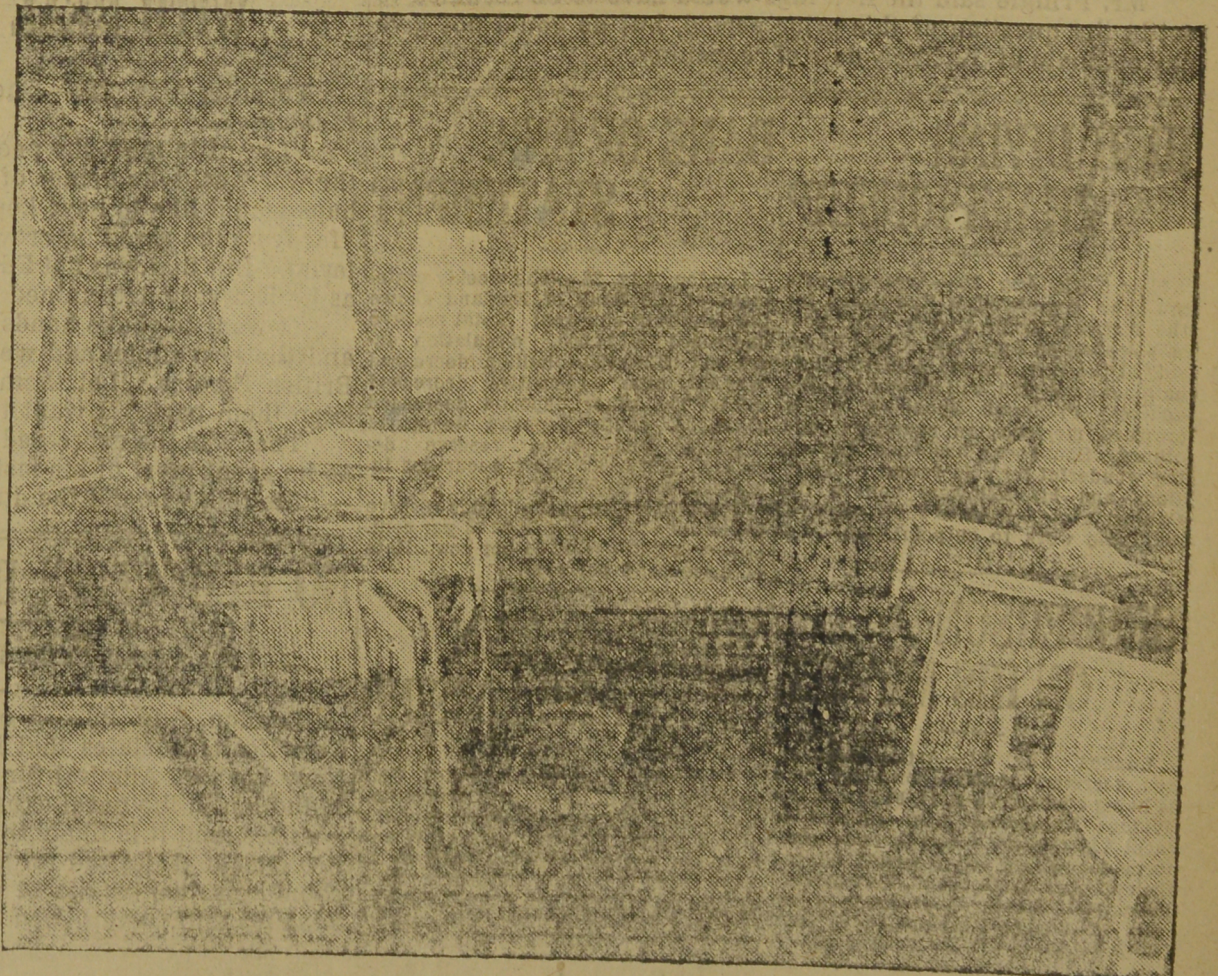
