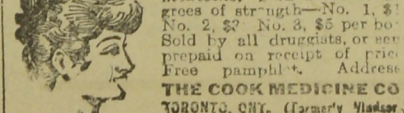

THE PRINCE'S
SPEECHES HIS
OWN PRODUCT

(New York Times)

Whether or not the particularly graceful and discreet little speeches which the Prince of Wales has been making since his arrival in the United States are what is called extemporaneous—that is a question of no particular importance. They sound as if they were, and nothing more is required. Being, evidently either a notably wise young man or one notably well advised and equally competent to profit by good counsel, the chances are that he thinks out carefully beforehand what he shall say whenever he foresees a demand for oratory. That the speeches are his own it is as unnecessary as it would be ungracious to doubt, for there appears in them, here and there, a certain, not boyishness, but young-mannishness that would not be in them if they were the products of older heads than his. That they are not even edited by anybody else is more than hinted by an occasional venturing into the humorous. That would be avoided if the responsibility of his position were felt as a burden, instead of being only realized as a privilege not without its amusing side for a truly modern youth. Observe, for instance, that in the brief expression of thanks for welcome, addressed to the American people, the Prince wrote, "Your aims are as democratic as ours." An older Briton would probably have said the same thing in another way—the directly contrary way—"Our aims are as democratic as yours." The implication of a possibility of finding here less democracy than in monarchical England, though veiled, is clear, and it contains the element of the unexpected that is the peculiarity one sort of jokes.

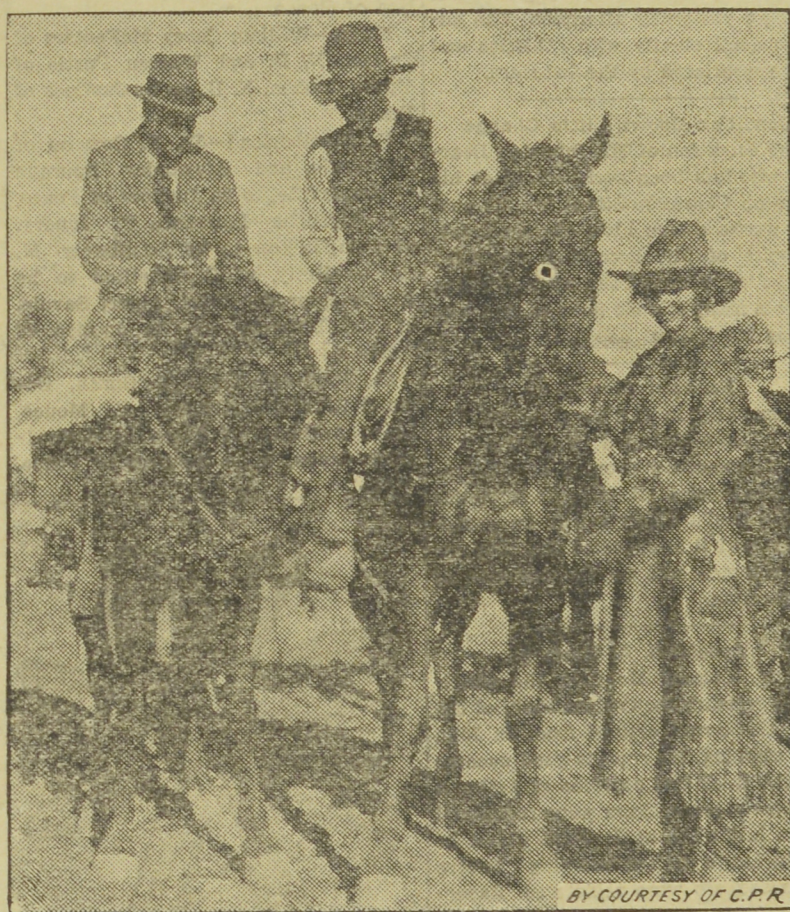
