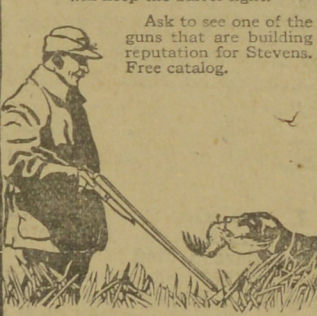

POWER POSSIBILITIES OF THE
NIAGARA OF NEW BRUNSWICK

A Descriptive Sketch of Grand Falls, a Great Attraction for Tourists Who Visit the Province—The "Well Rocks" and "The Churn" and "Lovers' Leap" Described a Moncton Newspaper Writer.

Much has been related of the natural assets of this province, but among those mentioned one receives little comment and that only, by those persons the more effected by the progress of the country in which this natural asset is to be found. The asset referred to, is the celebrated falls on the Saint John River at the town of Grand Falls. The location of these falls with its natural and artificial surroundings make them the best in the province of New Brunswick.

A Moncton Transcript representative who visited Grand Falls recently gleaned the following facts—

Some years ago, many years it is stated, and this handed down to posterity from older generations, there was an idea, then in vogue, to develop these falls to a maximum of utility whereby they might be of more benefit to the people of the province. A mill man it is said conceived the idea which was that of harnessing the falls for water development in the carrying on of operations for the benefit of lumbermen. His proposal was to erect a large dam with a large sluice way so that he might utilize the waters and still grant other logs running freedom to the southern waters of the province. He failed in this as money was the requisite, and he lacked this needed asset himself, and failed to arouse the enthusiasm of others.

Finally as Father Time counted the decades in moments, minutes, months and years, another project was on foot that of developing the falls for electric development. A company composed of many, of the then, imposing personages, with worldly means at their disposal, thought to develop the falls at once. They became leagued with some others who promised development and a lease for a long term of years was given the new company by the town fathers on condition that they, at once set out to develop the falls. The lease was attained and chalked down in figures which are yet recorded. Time wore along; the company moved machinery on the premises, and finally sold out their interests to another firm who promised development at once, and the citizens and countrymen surrounding expected to see the falls developed in an over-night job.

Hindered by War
Then the war clouds clouded a peaceful sky, and the newer company applied to the government of the day for time to develop their proposed enterprise. Finally they entered the plea that they desired to await until the signing of the peace terms, and the end of the war before taking up anew their work. At first this was not readily listened to, but finally an agreement was struck whereby the new company was to be given until the official signing of peace terms, when they were to again renew operations. The agreement hit upon was that the company should agree to spend \$100,000 in development between the day of the signing of the peace terms and one year after that date.

The war was fought and won, but still the falls are undeveloped. True it is, that some officials have paid a visit to the place during the month of July.

Drop of 74 Feet

"The present time is the moment in which something must be done," said one optimist. "It is conceded in all quarters that these falls, which have a drop of seventy-four feet are

Aroostook Falls.
A short distance away lies the small Aroostook Falls. These are a series of pitches, which fall like a stairway.
