CINCINNATI REDS WIN THE FIRST GAME, NINE TO ONE

More Than Thirty Thousand Fans Witness the Struggle—Reuther Bats 1,000 and Owner Says Reds Have Two More Twirlers Like Him—Weather Hot and Clear—Garry Herrmann Confident—Second Game of Series Today.

Cincinnati, Oct. 1—Cincinnati today won the opening game of the world's series from the Chicago Americans by a score of 9 to 1.

Every series develops a new idol for the fans, and Walter Reuther who pitched the Reds to victory was the unanimous choice today. He not only held the White Sox to six scattered hits and really deserved a shut-out, but rolled up a batting average of 1,000 for himself.

After the game Garry Herrman, owner of the Reds, who came panting up the runway of grandstands stopped long enough to remark to friends. "Those dopesters that were figuring Cincinnati second did not figure on our batting pitchers. We've got two more like Reuther; they've all been batting around .300 all season."

The day was clear and hot and 30,511 fans witnessed the contest. Cincinnati has already been known as a thorough-going baseball town, supporting the home team in good season and bad, but nerves were on edge today with the importance of the struggle in store. This was made evident by the abrupt termination of the waves of cheering until the inundation of runs in the fourth relaxed the tension and the cheering became wild and prolonged.

The Play

The ground rules were announced as two bases on a ball hit into left crowd and three bases in the right field crowd.

First Inning

White Sox, J. Collins up, ball one, ball two, strike one. J. Collins singled to center. It was a line drive that landed directly. Eddie Collins up. Ball one, strike one. Eddie Collins forced J. Collins at second. Reuther to Kopf, E. Collins attempted to sacrifice. Weaver up, ball one, strike one. Eddie Collins out stealing. Wingo to Rath. Weaver flied out to Rousch, the latter making a great one-handed catch. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Second half—Rath up, strike one. Rath was hit by pitched ball on the back and walked. Daubert up. Strike one. Daubert singled to centre, Rath taking third. Groh up, ball one, ball two. Groh flied to Jackson and Rath beat Jackson's throw home. Daubert remaining on first. Rousch up, ball one, ball two, strike one. Daubert out stealing second. Schalk's throw was too high. Strike two. Duncan was out. Risberg to Gandil. One run, one hit, no errors.

Second Inning

First half—Jackson up. On Jackson's drive to Kopf the latter threw wild to first and Jackson took second. Felsch up. Felsch sacrificed. Reuther to Daubert. Jackson taking third. Gandil up, Gandil singled to center, Jackson scores.

Risberg up, strike one, ball one. Gandil caught stealing. Wingo to Rath, ball two, strike two, ball three. Risberg walks. Schalk up, ball one, strike one, ball two, flied to Rousch. One run, one hit, one error.

Second half—Kopf up. Strike one, strike two, Kopf fanned. Neal up, strike one, ball one, Neal out. E. Collins to Gandil. Wingo up, ball one, strike one, flied to Felsch. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Third Inning

First half—Cicotte up, strike one, strike two, fanned. J. Collins up, strike one, ball one. J. Collins flied to Rousch. E. Collins up, ball one, strike one, ball two, ball three, strike two. Kopf threw out Collins at first. No hits, no runs, no errors.

Second half—Reuther up, ball one, strike one, ball two, ball three, ball. he walked. Rath up. Rath sacrificed. Cicotte to Gandil. Reuther going to second. Daubert up. Ball one, flied to Jackson. Reuther returning to second. Groh up. Ball one, strike one, ball two, strike two. He flied to Jackson. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Fourth Inning

First half—Weaver up. Out grounded. Groh to Daubert. Jackson up, ball one, strike one. Kopf threw out Jackson. Daubert taking the throw. Felsch up, strike one, Felsch thrown out.

Kopf to Daubert. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Second half—Rousch up he bled out to Felsch. Duncan up, ball one, he singled to right center. Kopf up. Cicotte took Kopf first drive, throwing to second, forcing Duncan. Risberg taking the throw.

Neale up, he singled to second, Kopf reaching second safely. Wingo up, he hit a single. Kopf scoring on the throw to the plate. Reuther up, ball one, Neale and Wingo score on Reuther's triple to centre field bleachers. Rath up, ball one, ball two. Rath doubles in to left field bleachers scoring Reuther.

Daubert up. Strike two, ball one. Cicotte taken out of box being replaced by Wilkinson. Daubert singles to left bringing in Rath. Daubert took second on throw. Groh up, ball one, strike one. Groh flied to Felsch. Five runs, six hits no errors.

Fifth Inning

First half—Gandil up. Ball one, strike one, he singles to center. Risberg up, he bled to Rousch. Gandil holding first. Schalk up, strike one, Groh took Schalk's drive and throwing to Rath forced Gandil. Schalk on first. Wilkinson up, he forced Schalk at second, Rath unassisted. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Second half—Rousch up, strike one, Rousch bled to Felsch. Duncan ball one, Duncan singles to center. Kopf up strike one, ball one, ball two. Duncan was caught stealing Schalk to Risberg. Strike two ball three, Risberg threw out Kopf at first after making a great stop. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Sixth Inning

First half—J. Collins up, strike one, ball one, Collins safe on a single which was too hot for Reuther to handle. Weaver up, the first one he hit to right, Collins taking second. Jackson up, out grounds to Daubert, unassisted. E. Collins on third. Weaver on second, Felsch up flied to Neale. No runs, two hits, no errors.

Second half—Neale up ball one, he singled to centre. Wingo up, foul strike one, fouls, strike two. He fanned. Reuther up, ball one, ball two, foul strike he singled to right Neale going to second. Rath up, strike one, ball two, he flied to Risberg. Neale was doubled up. Risberg to E. Collins. No runs two hits, no errors.

Seventh Inning

First half—Gandil up, strike one, he flied to Neale. Risberg up, out. Rath to Daubert. Schalk up, out. Groh to Daubert. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Second half—Daubert up, strike one, ball one, he triples into right field crowd. Groh up ball one, strike one, foul, strike two, ball two. Daubert scored on Groh's single to centre field. Rousch up, on Rousch's bunt Weaver threw wide and Rousch was safe. Groh taking third. Duncan up. Duncan forced Rousch. Groh scoring. Kopf up, he hits into double play, Risberg to E. Collins to Gandil. Two runs, two hits one error.

Eighth Inning

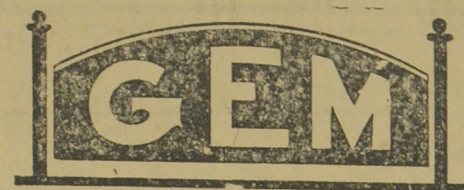

Eddie Collins up, he flied to Rousch. McMullen still on first. Weaver up, ball one, he flied to Rousch. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Second half—Lowdermilk relieves Wilkinson on the mound for Chicago. Neale up strike one, he singles to left. Wingo up, he sacrifices. Lowdermilk to Gandil. Neale taking second. Reuther up. Fouls, strike one, ball one. Reuther tripled to centre field scoring Neale. Rath up, ball one, out. Risberg to Gandil. Reuther holds third. Daubert up, ball one ball two, strike one, strike two, ball three. He was hit on the head by a pitched ball. He dropped as though knocked out but soon recovered and walked to first. Groh up, ball one, ball two, ball three, strike one, ball four. He walks filling the sacks. Rousch up, ball one, he forces Groh. E. Collins to Risberg. One run, two hits, no errors.

Ninth Inning

First half—Jackson up, he flied to Neale. Felsch up, foul strike one, strike two, he flied to Rousch. Rousch making a sensational catch. Gandil up, out. Rath to Daubert. No runs, no hits no errors.
