

WOMEN IN THE NEWS.

Girl Who Eloped with Rev. Jere Cooke Has Secured Her Inheritance.

Mrs. Florence Whaley Cooke has received her inheritance and it will be a big lift to the now careworn wife of the rector, Jere Cooke, of Hempstead, who left his wife and family to elope with the girl. They have a little family now, and the former rector has had to work hard for indifferent results. But now Mrs. Cooke's grandmother, Mrs. Keziah Whaley, guardian for Florence and her sister, under her son's will, has died, and the girls will receive their \$100,000. Grandma was 86 and tenacious of life. She forgave her granddaughter but steadfastly refused to increase her original allowance, holding that Cooke must support her. The ex-rector's wife got a divorce after long refusing, and the elopers 12 years ago thought the bedridden grandmother might soon be forced by nature to end her trust.

Miss Ethel Barrymore (Mrs. Russell Colt, of Providence) won the hearts of the wounded soldiers at various hospitals in New York yesterday, when, learning that bathing suits were scarce she bought up all local stocks and impressed enough from the summer colony to give every one of the 200 able lads a natty suit.

Commander Evangeline Booth was given an ovation at Atlantic City the other day by the Elks, when she addressed their convention on the work of the Salvation Army overseas. "Our secret was that we were ready," she said, "and Flanders mud was not so much different from American gutters. Our people had ministered to the sick and dying under all conditions and were undismayed. A war calls for skilled men and women, and it is not a place for the blunders. Good intentions count for naught if negated by clumsy execution. We sent abroad only those who had been trained, and we sent only those of big calibre. Ours is a practical religion."

Miss Rose Rothenburg, the New York lawyer, is only 26, but she is such a good lawyer that Dist. Attorney Swann has named her as special assistant and she will handle the cases of girls haled into court by the police. There have been a lot of raw mistakes made lately by zealous Hylandites arresting the wrong women, and the district attorney's new assistant will investigate these cases before any more reputations are smirched needlessly.

Mrs. Goelet and Mrs. Cornelius Vanderbilt are running neck-and-neck in the great Newport stakes for supremacy, induced by the coming visit of the Prince of Wales. He has accepted their hospitality and each is preparing to outshine the other. Each has announced a most recherche, rococco and al fresco function—but neither has named the day. All sorts of notables are to attend, and social secretaries are about fagged. The prince will visit the Vanderbilts because he accepted the general's invitation on the battlefield. He will visit the Goelets because they are old family friends of the prince's father. The Navy Department is to have a lot of warships as escort for the future monarch, and the two hostesses may yet have to divide first money in the entertainment purse.

NOVA SCOTIA WAR VETERANS IN CONVENTION

New Glasgow, July 16.—A resolution requesting Premier Murray to instruct W. B. McCoy, secretary of the Nova Scotia Returned Soldiers' Commission to appear before the convention for the purpose of answering questions pertaining to his administration, was adopted at the opening session of the Provincial Great War Veterans' Association held here yesterday. A resolution requiring that Mr. McCoy be not admitted to the convention if on investigation it was found that he was of military age and had not proceeded to the front, was thrown out on the ground that it would defeat the chief purpose the convention had in mind in treating with the official.

Another resolution which met with overwhelming defeat was that providing for the immediate dismissal of all government employees between the ages of twenty-one and forty who are single and did not prove that they were physically unfit or had volunteered for overseas service during the war, and before the Military Service Act came into force. The sessions are continuing today.
