WHAT NURSE SAYS.

All Dishes Used to Prepare Baby's
Meals Should be Kept by
Themselves.

There should be a dish kept just to sterilize his bottles and his cereal should be made in a double boiler used for nothing else. This is one of the little things that keep away the big things—little precautions that prevent big illnesses.

Baby's orange juice or broth should be strained through gauze. Be sure to have a separate piece of gauze for the different purposes and to boil it thoroughly before using and to wash it out thoroughly after using each day.

When baby gets old enough to eat vegetables and other foods, you should have for him a feeding plate. Hot water held in the bottom of the plate keeps the food hot and wholesome throughout his feeding. Tell some member of the family who is always bringing baby useless toys about this plate. It would make a nice present.

For the Wiggler.

If baby is a "wiggler" you will find it convenient to fasten him in his crib. Nurse says that it is best to do this by a sort of heavy muslin belt that may be made by folding a baby's napkin four times lengthwise. Fasten this belt through the pad, rubber and mattress by means of two strong big safety pins, and then when baby is put down, draw the belt about comfortably under the arms and fasten it securely by means of two smaller safety pins.

Baby will likely go to sleep sooner if he finds that he is unable to thrash about or to stand up. For the pins to fasten the belt to the mattress you will find blanket pins best because they are large enough to go through all the padding and rubber and mattress. If you cannot get the sort of pins you want in a department store go to a harness store and get horse blanket pins. You may be sure that they will be strong enough for any baby and the points are splendid.

Making Broth.

If the doctor says that baby may take broth, be sure to follow the directions given by some baby authority, for the ordinary broth you would make for adults would not be suitable. It should never be seasoned save for a little salt, and the greatest care should be taken to free it from grease. Moreover, it should be cooked three or four hours over low heat.

WINTER FURS.

Neckpieces with practically no exception are made in straight scarf form, in various lengths and widths. Collarettes and fancy shoulder capes have some representation.

In pelts mink takes first place for garments and neckpieces, as well as for trimmings of cloth suits.

Brown and tan being the fashionable colors in both silk and wool fabrics, revival of interest in mink as a trimming, and in kolinsky, are well spoken of, notably kolinsky in the light yellow of the natural color.

Natural colored gray hare is in demand too as a trimming; gray squirrel still holds its own.

RANDOM REMINDERS.

To make a fowl of doubtful age tender, add a teaspoonful of apple juice to the water in which it is boiled.

To prevent mold from forming on top of the liquid in which pickles are kept, put in a few pieces of horse-radish root.

A small piece of orris root placed in the boiler in which handkerchiefs are boiled will give them a perfume that will last.

Handkerchiefs for sports wear are of an all-over design on a solid color. If for more formal wear they have the hand embroidery with the dominant unit in color, the background embroidered in white.

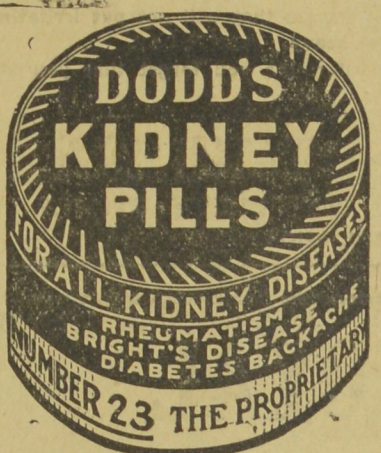
